14	TO BE ENTITLED
15	AN ACT

17	To create the position of senior status judge; to
18	provide that a retired circuit or district judge may request
19	to serve as a senior status judge; to provide for the
20	assignment and acceptance of cases by a senior status judge;
21	and to provide for the duties and compensation of a senior
22	status judge.
23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. (a) There is created the position of
25	senior status judge. A senior status judge is a retired
26	circuit or district judge who continuously presides over a

reduced docket. A senior status judge may work at a one-quarter, one-third, or one-half rate.

- (b) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, a senior status judge shall receive his or her full retirement benefits and, in addition, shall be compensated at a rate equal to one-quarter, one-third, or one-half of the starting salary for a circuit or district judge depending upon the level of docket the senior status judge elects to maintain.
- (c) A senior status judge shall not be entitled to any additional retirement or other benefits for the time he or she serves as a senior status judge.
- Section 2. (a) A request to be considered a senior status judge may be made to the Administrative Office of Courts and the presiding circuit judge for the judicial circuit in which the retired judge wishes to work.
- (b) A request to become a senior status judge shall be approved by the Administrative Office of Courts and the appropriate presiding circuit judge.
- (c) The approval of a request to serve as a senior status judge shall include the percentage of a normal docket that will be maintained by the senior status judge.
- (d) The approval of a request to serve as a senior status judge shall be valid for a two-year period. The request to serve as a senior status judge may be renewed at the end of the initial two-year period with the consent of the person serving, the appropriate presiding circuit judge, and the Administrative Office of Courts.

Section 3. The Administrative Office of Courts, in conjunction with all presiding circuit judges, shall adopt rules to ensure that cases are assigned in the appropriate manner and percentage to senior status judges. No person shall be allowed to serve as a senior status judge pursuant to this act until the rules required by this section have been adopted.

Section 4. A person serving as a senior status judge shall be prohibited from engaging in the practice of law and shall be subject to Chapter 25 of Title 36, Code of Alabama 1975, the Cannons of Judicial Ethics, and all other relevant standards applicable to a regular sitting circuit or district judge.

Section 5. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
