23	free speech; to provide that expression of speech by a student
24	journalist is not deemed an expression of university policy;
25	and to absolve universities from liability for student
26	journalist expressions of speech.
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1 Section 1. (a) As used in this section, the 2 following words have the following meanings: (1) INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION. A four-year 3 4 university located in Alabama which offers a bachelor's degree 5 or higher advanced degrees. (2) UNIVERSITY-SPONSORED MEDIA. Any material that 6 7 is: a. Prepared, written, published, or broadcast by a 8 student journalist at a public institution of higher 9 10 education; and 11 b. Distributed or generally made available to 12 members of the student body. 13 c. The term university-sponsored media does not include material that is intended for distribution or 14 transmission solely in the classroom in which the material is 15 16 produced. 17 (3) UNIVERSITY POLICY. The policy established by the 18 institution's board of trustees or its administration acting on behalf of the board of trustees. 19 20 Section 2. Each institution of higher education 21 under the authority of a separate board of trustees may adopt 22 a written university policy regarding policies for freedom of speech for university-sponsored media, which shall include 23 24 reasonable provisions. The board shall make the policy 25 available to the students and their parents. 26 Section 3. (a) A student journalist may exercise 27 freedom of speech and freedom of the press in

- 1 university-sponsored media, to the fullest extent permitted by
 2 law.
- 3 (b) Students shall not express, publish, or4 distribute any of the following:

(1) Materials that are libelous or slanderous.

6 (2) Materials that constitute an unwarranted 7 invasion of privacy.

(3) Materials that violate federal or state law.

9 (4) Materials that incite students to create a clear 10 and present danger of the commission of an unlawful act, the 11 violation of university policies, or the material and 12 substantial disruption of the orderly operation of an 13 institution of higher education.

(5) Materials that are obscene.

15 Section 4. Any expression made by student

journalists in the exercise of free speech shall not be deemed to be an expression of university policy, its employees, or officials, nor shall the university be liable in any civil or criminal action for any student journalist expression made or published through any university-sponsored media.

21 Section 5. This act shall become effective October22 1, 2016.
