Under existing law, a regional care 14 15 organization has until October 1, 2016, to obtain 16 its full certification, and all probationary 17 certifications expire on October 1, 2016. 18 This bill would authorize the State Medicaid 19 Agency to establish a later date for obtaining 20 regional care organization certification and would 21 authorize probationary certification to be extended beyond October 1, 2016. 22 23 24 A BILL 25 TO BE ENTITLED 26 AN ACT 27

1 Relating to the State Medicaid Agency; to amend Sections 22-6-156, 22-6-159, and 22-6-162, to authorize the 2 agency to provide further for the time frame for an 3 organization to obtain regional care organization 4 5 certification and to extend the date in which a probationary 6 status expires. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: Section 1. Sections 22-6-156, 22-6-159, and 8 22-6-162, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as 9 10 follows: "§22-6-156. 11 12 "The Medicaid Agency may contract with an alternate care provider in a Medicaid region only under the terms of 13 this section: 14 15 "(1) If a regional care organization failed to 16 provide adequate service pursuant to its contract, or had its 17 certification terminated, or if the Medicaid Agency could not 18 award a contract to a regional care organization under the 19 terms of Section 22-6-153, or if no organization had been 20 awarded a regional care organization certificate by October 1, 21 2016, or a later date established by the Medicaid Agency if an 22 extension is determined, in the Medicaid Agency's sole discretion, to be in the best interest of the state, then the 23 24 Medicaid Agency shall first offer a contract, to resume 25 interrupted service or to assume service in the region, under 26 the conditions of Section 22-6-153 to any other regional care

organization that Medicaid judged would meet its quality
 criteria.

"(2) If by October 1, 2014, no organization had a 3 probationary regional care organization certification in a 4 5 region. However, the Medicaid Agency could extend the deadline until January 1, 2015, if it judged an organization was making 6 7 reasonable progress toward getting probationary certification. 8 If the Medicaid Agency judged that no organization in the region likely would achieve probationary certification by 9 10 January 1, 2015, then the Medicaid Agency shall let any 11 organization with probationary or full regional care 12 organization certification apply to develop a regional care 13 organization in the region. If at least one organization made such an application, the agency no sooner than October 1, 14 2015, would decide whether any organization could reasonably 15 16 be expected to become a fully certified regional care 17 organization in the region and its initial region.

18 "(3) If an organization lost its probationary 19 certification before October 1, 2016, or a later date 20 established by the Medicaid Agency if an extension is determined, in the Medicaid Agency's sole discretion, to be in 21 22 the best interest of the state, Medicaid shall offer any other 23 organization with probationary or full regional care 24 organization certification, which it judged could successfully 25 provide service in the region and its initial region, the 26 opportunity to serve Medicaid beneficiaries in both regions.

"(4) The Medicaid Agency may contract with an 1 2 alternate care provider only if no regional care organization 3 accepted a contract under the terms of subdivision (1), no organization was granted the opportunity to develop a regional 4 5 care organization in the affected region under the terms of subdivision (2), or no organization was granted the 6 7 opportunity to serve Medicaid beneficiaries under the terms of 8 subdivision (3).

9 "(5) The Medicaid Agency may contract with an 10 alternate care provider under the terms of subdivision (4) 11 only if, in the judgment of the Medicaid Agency, care of 12 Medicaid enrollees would be better, more efficient, and less 13 costly than under the then existing care delivery system. 14 Medicaid may contract with more than one alternate care 15 provider in a Medicaid region.

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"§22-6-159.

17 "(a) The following is the timeline for18 implementation of this article:

19 "(1) Not later than October 1, 2013, the Medicaid20 Agency shall establish Medicaid regions.

"(2) Not later than October 1, 2014, an organization seeking to become a regional care organization shall have established a governing board and structure as approved by the Medicaid Agency. An organization may receive probationary certification as a regional care organization upon submission of an application for, and demonstration of, a governing board acceptable to the Medicaid Agency. Probationary certification

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shall expire no later than on October 1, 2016, or a later date
 established by the Medicaid Agency.

"(3) Not later than April 1, 2015, an organization
with probationary regional care organization certification
shall have demonstrated to Medicaid's approval the ability to
establish an adequate medical service delivery network.

7 "(4) Not later than October 1, 2015, an organization 8 with probationary regional care organization certification 9 shall have demonstrated to Medicaid's approval that it has met 10 the solvency and financial requirements for a regional care 11 organization as outlined in this article.

12 "(5) Not later than On October 1, 2016, or a later 13 date established by the Medicaid Agency, an organization with 14 probationary regional care organization certification shall 15 demonstrate to Medicaid's approval that it is capable of 16 providing services pursuant to a risk contract.

"(b) The timeline and benchmarks in subsection (a)
shall not preclude an organization from meeting the timelines
and benchmarks at an earlier date.

20 "(c) Failure to meet and maintain any one of the benchmarks in subdivisions (2) to (5), inclusive, shall 21 22 constitute grounds for termination of a probationary regional 23 care organization certification or full regional care organization certification. The Medicaid Agency shall award 24 25 full regional care organization certification to an organization with probationary regional care organization 26 27 certification if the organization timely meets each of those

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benchmarks. Failure by an organization to timely meet one or more of those benchmarks shall not prevent the Medicaid Agency, at its sole discretion, from granting full regional care organization certification to the organization as long as it has met all of those benchmarks by October 1, 2016, or a later date established by the Medicaid Agency.

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"§22-6-162.

8 "The Medicaid Agency may contract for case-management services with an organization that has been 9 10 granted by the Medicaid Agency a probationary regional care 11 organization certification. If the agency has contracted with 12 such an organization, and that organization on or before October 1, 2016, or a later date established by the Medicaid 13 14 Agency, has failed to gain full regional care organization 15 certification or has had its probationary certification 16 terminated, then that organization shall refund half the 17 payments, made by the Medicaid Agency to the organization for 18 case-management services, paid over the previous 12 months."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
