Section 1. (a) Whenever a defendant convicted of a 19 20 traffic infraction is sentenced to pay a fine, penalty, or 21 court cost, and the defendant is unable to make payment of the 22 fine, penalty, or court cost within 30 days of sentencing, the 23 court shall order the defendant to pay the fine, penalty, or 24 court cost in deferred payments or installments or to perform 25 community service as a means of payment. The court may 26 authorize the clerk to establish and approve the conditions of 27 all deferred payment or installment agreements or community

service agreements pursuant to guidelines established by the 1 2 court. As a condition of the agreement, a defendant who enters into a payment or installment agreement or community service 3 agreement shall promptly inform the court of any change of 4 5 mailing address during the term of the agreement. The court may assess a one-time fee not to exceed ten dollars (\$10) to 6 7 cover the costs of management of the defendant's account until the account is paid in full. 8

9 (b) When a court has authorized a deferred payment 10 or installment agreement or community service agreement in 11 accordance with this section, the driver's license of the 12 defendant may not be suspended or revoked, provided the 13 defendant is making timely payments or performing community 14 service in accordance with his or her agreement.

Section 2. A defendant's driver's license may not be suspended or revoked solely on the grounds of a failure to appear in connection with a traffic violation.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
