8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the operation of bingo
9 games by qualifying nonprofit organizations in
10 Etowah County is authorized by Amendment 506 to the
11 Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

This bill would propose an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to define bingo to include bingo played on any electronic machine or device authorized under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act and operated by a Native American tribe in Alabama and played at a single location in Etowah County, create the Etowah County Gaming Commission and provide for its duties and powers, impose a local gross receipts tax of 12.5 percent on gaming revenue and a local bingo game vendor tax of four percent and provide for the distribution of the proceeds, and create the Etowah County Interstate 759 Extension Authority to which a portion of the proceeds would be distributed for specified purposes.

| 23 | PROPOSED AMENDMENT   |
| 24 | Section 1. For the purposes of this amendment, the             |
| 25 | following words have the following meanings:                   |
| 26 | (1) BINGO. That specific kind of game played on any            |
| 27 | electronic machine or device that is authorized by the         |

National Indian Gaming Commission pursuant to the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, 25 U.S.C. § 2701 et seq., and is operated by any Native American tribe in Alabama.

- (2) EQUIPMENT. Any electronic machine or device that is authorized by the National Indian Gaming Commission, pursuant to the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, 25 U.S.C. § 2701 et seq., and operated by any Native American tribe in Alabama.
- (3) GAMING GROSS REVENUE. The total amount of money or value in any form received with respect to the playing of electronic bingo, less the total money or value in any form paid as prizes or winnings to the players of a bingo game and free play or promotional credits, but not after deduction of any expenses incurred in operating the establishment, including, but not limited to, depreciation or leasing costs of physical facilities and equipment, wages and other employment costs, utilities, interest, and taxes.
- (4) OPERATOR. The limited liability company holding, as of January 1, 2016, the development agreement with the Etowah County Commission or another operator approved by both the holder of the development agreement and the Etowah County Gaming Commission.

Section 2. Bingo for prizes or money may be operated by the operator at one location in Etowah County. If the operator changes locations, the operator may operate in both locations for not more than 15 days. The Etowah County Gaming Commission shall adopt rules for licensing, permitting, and operation of bingo games within the county. The Etowah County

Gaming Commission shall insure compliance with the rules or regulations of all of the following:

- (1) No person under the age of 19 shall be permitted to play bingo; nor shall any person under the age of 19 be permitted to conduct or assist in the conduct of bingo.
- (2) Bingo games shall be operated only on the premises owned or leased by the operator.
- (3) The operator may pay consulting fees, compensation, and salary to any individual or entity for any services performed in relation to the operation or conduct of a bingo game.
- (4) The operator may not lend its name or allow its identity to be used by any other person or entity in the operating or advertising of a bingo game in which the operator is not directly and solely operating the bingo game.
- Section 3. (a) A local gross receipts tax of 12 and one-half percent is levied on the gaming gross revenue of the operator.
- (b) The local gross receipts tax on gaming gross revenue for each calendar month shall be paid to the Etowah County Gaming Commission on or before the 20th day of the next succeeding calendar month.
- (c) The Etowah County Gaming Commission shall apportion the local gross receipts tax as follows:
- (1) The proceeds from the tax of four percent to the Etowah County Interstate 759 Extension Authority, up to twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000), the purpose of

which is to provide a source of local funding to contribute to federal and state funding to construct the Interstate 759

Extension in Etowah County. Thereafter, these proceeds will be divided as follows:

- a. The proceeds from the tax of .8 percent to the Riverfront Development Committee for the development and management of the riverfront in the county.
- b. The proceeds from the tax of .8 percent to the Etowah County Mega Sports Authority for the development and management of a public sports complex in Etowah County.
- c. The proceeds from the tax of .8 percent to the Etowah County Road Improvement Highway Development Committee for the improvement of the Etowah County public roads.
- d. The proceeds from the tax of .8 percent to the Etowah County Economic Growth Committee to create new jobs in Etowah County.
- e. The proceeds from the tax of .8 percent to the Etowah County Interstate 759 Extension Authority.
- f. If any of the committees referenced in this subdivision have not been established prior to receiving any allocation, the committee is not eligible for prior proceeds but shall begin receiving proceeds within the first month immediately following the date the committee is established.
- (2) The proceeds from the tax of one-half of one percent shall be retained by the Etowah County Gaming Commission to provide for all reasonable and necessary

expenses incurred by the commission in the furtherance of its duties.

- (3) The proceeds from the tax of one-half of one percent to the Etowah County Commission which shall be apportioned among the municipalities in the county on the basis of the ratio of the population of the municipality to the population of all the municipalities in the county and pay the amounts apportioned to the municipalities.
- (4) The proceeds from the tax of one percent to the Etowah County Commission which shall be apportioned among the school boards in the county on the basis of average daily attendance to be used for technical education.
- (5) The proceeds from the tax of one-half of one percent to the Etowah County Commission Development Committee which shall be divided equally among the three House of Representatives districts in Etowah County. The funds in each district shall be expended only on projects located in the respective House district. The expenditure of funds for each respective district shall be voted on and approved by the respective House district appointee and the Senate appointee. The House appointee and the Senate appointee for a district may call a district meeting for the purpose of this provision.
- (6) The proceeds from the tax of one and one-half percent to the Etowah County Sheriff for operation of the office of the sheriff.

1 (7) The proceeds from the tax of one-half of one 2 percent to the District Attorney for the 16th Circuit for 3 operation of the office of the district attorney.

- (8) The proceeds from the tax of one-half of one percent to the Circuit Clerk for the 16th Circuit for operation of the office of the circuit clerk.
- (9) The proceeds from the tax of one-half of one percent to the Etowah County Revenue Commissioner for operation of the office of the revenue commissioner.
- (10) The proceeds from the tax of one-half of one percent to the Etowah County Judge of Probate for operation of the office of the judge of probate.
- (11) The proceeds from the tax of one percent to the Etowah County Commission.
- (12) The proceeds from the tax of one-half of one percent to the Judges of the 16th Circuit and the District Judges of Etowah County which may be used only for bailiffs and other staff.
- (13) One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) annually to the Chamber of Gadsden/Etowah County for economic development and job promotion.
- (14) Two thousand dollars (\$2,000) annually to each volunteer fire department in Etowah County.
- (15) In any year in which the proceeds available for distribution under this section are insufficient to make all of the distributions made in this section, the distributions

of specific dollar amounts made by this section shall be reduced proportionately.

(16) Any proceeds from the remaining local gross receipts tax, based upon criteria adopted by the Etowah County Gaming Commission, shall be awarded by the Etowah County Gaming Commission to nonprofit organizations that provide services to the residents of Etowah County.

Section 4. (a) A local bingo game vendor tax is hereby levied on bingo game vendors conducting business in Etowah County in an amount equal to four percent of the gross revenues collected by the bingo game vendor from leases or other revenue sharing arrangements with the operator.

- (b) A bingo game vendor shall pay the local bingo game vendor tax for each calendar month to the Etowah County Gaming Commission on or before the 20th day of the next succeeding calendar month for deposit in the County General Fund. The local bingo game vendor tax shall be apportioned as follows:
- (1) The proceeds from the tax of one and one-half percent to the Etowah County Commission which shall be apportioned among the municipalities in the county on the basis of the ratio of the population of the municipality to the population of all the municipalities in the county and pay the amounts apportioned to the municipalities.
- (2) The proceeds from the tax of two and one-half percent to the Etowah County Mega Sports Authority for the

development and management of a public sports complex in Etowah County.

Section 5. The local gross receipts tax on gaming gross revenue, and the local bingo game vendor tax shall be in lieu of all other state or local taxes or license fees levied with respect to the conduct of bingo games by the operator. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the operator is liable for all income taxes, franchise taxes, property taxes, lodging taxes, and sales and use taxes on merchandise, food, and beverage generally applicable at uniform rates to all businesses operating in the county in which the operator is licensed.

Section 6. (a) There is created the Etowah County
Gaming Commission. The commission shall regulate and supervise
the operation and conduct of bingo under this amendment in
Etowah County, shall implement, regulate, administer, and
supervise all laws and rules related to the operation and
conduct of bingo by the operator in Etowah County, and shall
cooperate with the district attorney and sheriff of Etowah
County in enforcing all laws related to illegal gambling. The
Etowah County Gaming Commission may retain an executive
director to manage the day-to-day operations of the commission
if necessary.

(b) The Etowah County Gaming Commission shall consist of seven members. One member of the commission shall be appointed by the Mayor's Association for Etowah County, one member shall be appointed by the Chamber of Gadsden/Etowah County, one member shall be appointed by the Etowah County

Sheriff, one member shall be appointed by the state Senator for the district encompassing Etowah County and one member shall be appointed by each member of the Alabama House of Representatives delegation for Etowah County. Members, where possible, shall represent the gender and racial diversity of the state.

- (c) Members of the commission shall be residents of the State of Alabama, residents of Etowah County, United States citizens, and prominent persons in their businesses or professions, may not have been convicted of a felony, and may not be the executive director of, or another employee of the commission, an officer of, or occupy an official position in any political party, an elected official, or actively engaged in the business of, or have a pecuniary interest in, an electronic gaming operation, racetrack, or casino.
- (d) Members shall serve a term of five years and may serve two complete terms and any portion of an initial term of less than five years or any portion of an expired term to which appointed. Any vacancy occurring on the commission shall be filled for the unexpired term by the appointing authority as described in this section. The initial term of office upon the effective date of this amendment shall be five years for the member appointed by the state Senator, five years for the three members appointed by the Alabama House of Representatives delegation for Etowah County, three years for the member appointed by the Mayor's Association, and two years for the members appointed by the Chamber of Gadsden/Etowah

County and the Etowah County Tourism Board. Each member of the commission shall serve for the duration of his or her term and until his or her successor is duly appointed; provided, however, that if a successor is not appointed within 120 days after the expiration of a member's term, a vacancy shall be

deemed to exist.

- (e) The commission and its members and employees shall be subject to the Ethics Law, Section 36-25-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975; the Open Records Act, Section 36-12-40, Code of Alabama 1975; the Open Meetings Act, Section 36-25A-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975; and the Administrative Procedure Act, Section 41-22-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975.
- Section 7. (a) There is created the Etowah County Interstate 759 Extension Authority.
  - Authority shall consist of seven members. One member of the authority shall be appointed by the Mayor's Association for Etowah County, one member shall be appointed by the Chamber of Gadsden/Etowah County, one member shall be appointed by the Etowah County Commission, one member shall be appointed by the state Senator for the district encompassing Etowah County and one member shall be appointed by each member of the Alabama House of Representatives delegation for Etowah County.

    Members, where possible, shall represent the gender and racial diversity of the state.
  - (c) Members of the authority shall be residents of the State of Alabama, residents of Etowah County, United

States citizens, and prominent persons in their businesses or professions, may not have been convicted of a felony, and may not be the executive director of, or another employee of, the authority.

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- (d) Members shall serve a term of five years and may serve two complete terms and any portion of an initial term of less than five years or any portion of an expired term to which appointed. Any vacancy occurring on the authority shall be filled for the unexpired term by the appointing authority as described in this section. The initial term of office upon the effective date of this amendment shall be five years for the member appointed by the state Senator, five years for the three members appointed by the Alabama House of Representatives delegation for Etowah County, three years for the member appointed by the Mayor's Association, and two years for the members appointed by the Chamber of Gadsden/Etowah County and the Etowah County Commission. Each member of the authority shall serve for the duration of his or her term and until his or her successor is duly appointed; provided, however, that if a successor is not appointed within 120 days after the expiration of a member's term, a vacancy shall be deemed to exist.
- (e) The authority shall receive the proceeds of the local gross receipts tax as provided in Section 3 and use those proceeds to provide a source of funding to construct the Interstate 759 extension in Etowah County. In addition, the authority has the power to do the following:

- 1 (1) To develop, promote, and provide a source of 2 funding for the Interstate 759 Extension in Etowah County.
  - (2) To acquire or lease real property for the Interstate 759 Extension in Etowah County.

- (3) To make, enter into, and execute contracts, agreements, or other instruments necessary to accomplish the purposes of this amendment.
- (4) To establish and appoint committees and hire staff it deems necessary for the carrying out of its functions.
- (5) To accept any and all donations and grants of money, equipment, supplies, materials, and services, and to receive, utilize, and dispose of it.
- (6) To perform other functions as may be necessary or appropriate to achieve the purposes of this amendment.

Section 8. Nothing in this amendment affects or prohibits conduct of bingo gaming under Amendment 506.

Section 9. Sections 8-1-150, 13A-12-20 to 13A-12-27, inclusive, and 13A-12-30, Code of Alabama 1975, do not apply to any bingo game authorized by this amendment and operated in accordance with the rules adopted by the Etowah County Gaming Commission.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Amendment 555 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 284.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of

Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Relating to Etowah County, proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to provide that the game of bingo may be played at a single location in Etowah County on any electronic machine or device that is authorized pursuant to the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act and is operated by any Native American tribe in Alabama; to levy a local gross receipts tax on bingo game revenue of the operator and a local bingo game vendor tax; to provide for the allocation of the tax proceeds; to create the Etowah County Gaming Commission to implement, regulate, and administer bingo under this amendment; and to create the Etowah County Interstate 759 Extension Authority to receive and expend a portion of the proceeds for the extension of Interstate 759 in Etowah County.
