1 "The legislature shall provide by law for he 2 retirement of judges, including supernumerary judges, with such conditions, retirement benefits, and pensions for them 3 and their dependents as it may prescribe. No person shall be elected or appointed to a judicial officer after reaching the 5 6 age of seventy 75 72 years, provided that a judge over the age 7 of seventy 75 72 may be appointed to the office of supernumerary judge if he is not eligible to receive state 8 judicial retirement benefits." 9 10 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 11 12 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 13 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 14 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 15 state. Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 16 17 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 18 following description of the substance or subject matter of 19 20 the proposed constitutional amendment: 21 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 22 Alabama of 1901, to increase the maximum age at which a person 23 may be elected or appointed to a judicial office from 70 years 24 to $\frac{75}{72}$ 72 years of age. "Proposed by Act ." 25 This description shall be followed by the following 26 27 language:
