25	Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other statute of
26	limitation or other law that may be construed to reduce the
27	statutory period for the commencement of a civil action

subject to this section, a civil action that may be commenced by a victim of any sex offense included in Section 15-20A-5, Code of Alabama 1975, for personal injuries resulting from the sexual abuse may be brought against the perpetrator of the abuse within two years from the final adjudication of the criminal case prosecuting the perpetrator of the sexual abuse, not including any appeal.

8 (b) The extended statute of limitation provided in 9 subsection (a) does not apply if the related criminal case 10 does not commence within two years of the alleged commission 11 of the sex offense.

12 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 13 first day of the third month following its passage and 14 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
