24	Section 1. This act shall only apply in a Class 2
25	municipalities.
26	Section 2. Effective January 1, 2017, any pilotage
27	commission in any Class 2 municipality, annually at the first

1 convened quarterly meeting after the release of official 2 annual changes to the Consumer Price Index, shall adjust the tariff rates to provide a cost-of-living adjustment to the 3 4 applicable tariff rates for bar pilots whose principal place of business is within the Class 2 municipality. For purposes 5 6 of this act, tariff rates are fees based on draft and tonnage 7 and other fees referenced in subsections (a) through (c) of Section 33-4-48 of the Code of Alabama 1975. The pilotage 8 commission shall use increases in the Consumer Price Index 9 10 published by the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of Labor Statistics, for the previous calendar year as a basis to make 11 12 the necessary upward adjustments. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the pilotage commission, upon request from pilots 13 14 or otherwise, may adjust tariff rates to an amount greater 15 than increases based on changes in the Consumer Price Index 16 for any given year.

Section 3. All laws or parts of laws which conflictwith this act are repealed.

Section 4. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the
Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
