2 Section 1. Sections 17-3-50 and 17-9-50, Code of

Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

4 "\$17-3-50.

"The boards of registrars in the several counties of the state shall not register any person as a qualified elector within 14 30 days prior to any election; provided, that the boards shall maintain open offices during business days in such 14-day 30-day period and on election day during the hours of voting.

"§17-9-50.

"Except as electors are admitted to vote and persons to assist them as herein provided, and except for the judge of probate, the sheriff, or his or her deputy, the precinct election officials, and watchers, no person shall be permitted within $\frac{30}{150}$ feet of the door of the building of the polling place."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
