2 ENROLLED, An Act,

To amend Section 11-52-31, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to municipal planning commissions and the adoption of subdivision regulations; to authorize a municipal planning commission to adopt regulations authorizing the administrative approval of minor subdivisions without a public hearing under certain conditions.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 11-52-31, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§11-52-31.

13 "(a) Except where the county commission is 14 responsible for the regulation of subdivision regulations 15 within the territorial jurisdiction of a municipal planning 16 commission pursuant to Section 11-52-30, the municipal 17 planning commission shall adopt subdivision regulations 18 governing the subdivision of land within its jurisdiction. The 19 regulations may provide for the proper arrangement of streets in relation to other existing or planned streets and to the 20 21 master plan, for adequate and convenient open spaces for 22 traffic, utilities, access of fire-fighting apparatus, 23 recreation, light and air and for the avoidance of congestion 24 of population, including minimum width and area of lots. The 25 regulations may include provisions as to the extent to which

streets and other ways shall be graded and improved and to 1 2 which water and sewer and other utility mains, piping, or 3 other facilities shall be installed as a condition precedent to the approval of the plat. The regulations or practice of 4 5 the municipal planning commission may provide for a tentative approval of the plat previous to the installation, but any 6 7 tentative approval shall be revocable and shall not be entered 8 on the plat. In lieu of the completion of the improvements and utilities prior to the final approval of the plat, the 9 10 municipal planning commission may accept a bond with surety to 11 secure to the municipality the actual construction and installation of the improvements or utilities at a time and 12 13 according to specifications fixed by or in accordance with the 14 regulations of the municipal planning commission. The 15 municipality is hereby granted the power to enforce the bond 16 by all appropriate legal and equitable remedies.

17 "(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, 18 regulations adopted by a municipal planning commission may 19 authorize administrative approval of a minor subdivision without a public hearing. A minor subdivision consists of the 20 21 subdivision of land into not more than six lots or a reduction 22 of the number of lots in an existing subdivision. The 23 developer of a minor subdivision approved by the municipal planning commission shall not require any public improvements, 24 the dedication of a public way, or the expenditure of any 25

public funds, and the plan for the minor subdivision shall not conflict with the master plan, official zoning map, any zoning ordinance, or any other subdivision regulations. This subsection does not require a municipal planning commission to authorize approval of a minor subdivision without first holding a public hearing.

7 "(c) All regulations shall be published as provided 8 by law for the publication of ordinances, and before adoption 9 a public hearing shall be held thereon. A copy thereof shall 10 be certified by the municipal planning commission to the 11 probate judge of the county in which the municipality and 12 territory are located."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
