13	Relating to Baldwin County; to authorize each member
14	of the county commission to employ an administrative

17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. In Baldwin County, each member of the
19	county commission may appoint one person to serve as
20	administrative secretary to the county commissioner during his
21	or her term of office. Prior to employment, a county
22	commissioner shall submit the name of the person to be
23	employed to the Baldwin County Commission for approval. The
24	administrative secretary shall be exempt from the county merit
25	system, shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing county
26	commissioner, and may be removed at will by the appointing

county commissioner. Upon removal or other vacancy in the

position of administrative secretary, a county commissioner may appoint another person to serve as administrative secretary in the same manner as provided above.

Section 2. (a) The compensation of each administrative secretary shall be fixed by the Baldwin County Commission. The administrative secretaries shall be paid at the same time as all other county employees. Each administrative secretary shall participate in and be eligible for benefits available to county employees.

(b) If any administrative secretary was a member of the county merit system at the time of appointment, upon termination, the person shall have the right to return to the employment of Baldwin County under the county merit system with full credit for time spent as an administrative secretary as if the individual had continued in the merit system.

Section 3. This act shall not limit the authority of the Baldwin County Commission to appoint, employ, or provide any other positions as provided by local or general law.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
