8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, lotteries and gift
9		enterprises are prohibited.
10		This bill would propose an amendment to
11		Section 65 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901,
12		to establish an Alabama Lottery to fund
13		scholarships, to create an Alabama Lottery
14		Corporation to implement and to regulate the
15		operation of such lottery, and to prohibit the
16		operation of casinos in the State.
17		The amendment dedicates the net proceeds
18		from the lottery to the Lottery Trust Fund for
19		scholarships for qualifying students to attend a
20		college or junior college located in Alabama. The
21		amendment establishes the Lottery Trust Fund and
22		authorizes the Legislature to pass general laws to
23		implement the amendment.

Proposing an amendment to Section 65 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 65 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, to establish an Alabama Lottery; to establish an Alabama Lottery Corporation; to establish the Lottery Trust Fund; to provide for the allocation of the lottery proceeds to the Lottery Trust Fund for scholarships for qualifying students to attend a college or junior college located in Alabama; to authorize the Legislature to implement the amendment through enabling legislation; and to prohibit the operation of casinos in the State.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284, 285 and 287 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Section 65 of Article IV of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

"Section 65.

"PART I.

1	"The Except as provided in Part II of this section,
2	the Legislature shall have no power to authorize lotteries or
3	gift enterprises for any purposes, and shall pass laws to
4	prohibit the sale in this state of lottery or gift enterprise
5	tickets, or tickets in any scheme in the nature of a lottery;
6	and all acts, or parts of acts heretofore passed by the
7	Legislature of this state, authorizing a lottery or lotteries,
8	and all acts amendatory thereof, or supplemental thereto, are
9	hereby avoided.
10	"PART II.
11	"(a) Establishment of an Alabama Lottery.
12	"The Legislature shall, by general law, provide for
13	the establishment, administration, operation, and regulation
14	of an Alabama Lottery.
15	"(b) Lottery Trust Fund.

"The proceeds from the Alabama Lottery shall be applied first to the payment of the expenses of administering and operating the Alabama Lottery, including, without limitation, the payment of all prizes, without any further appropriation required by law, and the balance of such proceeds remaining after such payments shall be deposited, as provided by general law, and held in a special, separate account in the State Treasury hereby created and designated the "Lottery Trust Fund" until such time as such proceeds are disbursed pursuant to this amendment.

"(c) Alabama Lottery Corporation.

1	"The administration of the Alabama Lottery shall be
2	vested in a corporation hereby created and designated the
3	"Alabama Lottery Corporation." The duties, powers, authority,
4	and composition of the Alabama Lottery Corporation shall be
5	provided by general law.
6	"(d) Allocations and Disbursements.
7	"(1) Monies in the Lottery Trust Fund shall be
8	allocated exclusively to provide scholarships to citizens of
9	Alabama who are A/B Honor Roll students to attend
10	universities, colleges, and junior, technical, or community
11	colleges located in Alabama.
12	"(e) Agreements with other Jurisdictions.
13	"The Alabama Lottery Corporation may enter into
14	reciprocal agreements with other jurisdictions for the
15	operation and promotion of games which are permitted to be
16	operated, utilized, or conducted by the Alabama Lottery.
17	"(f) Limitation on activities.
18	"The Alabama Lottery may authorize, conduct, employ,
19	include, or utilize only those games of chance approved by the
20	Alabama Lottery Corporation which may include, without
21	limitation, the sale of lottery tickets; provided, however,
22	that the Alabama Lottery is prohibited from operating, using,
23	or employing, or authorizing the operation, use, or employment
24	of, directly or indirectly, a casino or casinos and is further
25	prohibited from authorizing, conducting, employing, including,
26	or utilizing, directly or indirectly, any form of casino
27	gambling.

" <u>(g) Implementati</u>	on.

"The Legislature may enforce and implement this section by appropriate general law. Any act or acts that are enacted by the Alabama Legislature during the same session of the Legislature at which this amendment is proposed and which are in implementation and furtherance of the purposes of this amendment and the authority granted by this amendment, and all actions heretofore taken pursuant to such act or acts, are hereby validated, ratified, and confirmed as effective as of the date on which such act or acts were so enacted in accordance with the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and as of the respective dates on which such actions were taken.

"(h) Nothing in this amendment affects, prohibits, or limits any activity which was legal at the time this amendment becomes effective including, without limitation, pari-mutuel betting and nonprofit bingo as provided for by specific laws. Any games which are authorized by the National Indian Gaming Commission pursuant to the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, 25 U.S.C. § 2701 et seq., and which are operated by any Native American tribe in Alabama, may be played at a location licensed by a pari-mutuel racing commission at the time of the adoption of this amendment in any county where the game of bingo may be played pursuant to a constitutional amendment enacted after January 1, 2003.

"(i) The terms and provisions of this amendment and of any enabling legislation enacted by the Alabama Legislature

with respect to this amendment shall supersede and take 1 precedence over any other provision of law which may conflict 2 or be inconsistent with this amendment or such legislation, 3 4 and this amendment and such enabling legislation shall operate and be construed without regard to such conflict or 5 6

inconsistency."

Section 2. An election upon the above proposed amendment shall be held, in accordance with the provisions of Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the general election laws of Alabama.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description on the proposed constitutional amendment:

"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to establish an Alabama Lottery and an Alabama Lottery Trust Fund, to distribute net lottery proceeds to provide scholarships for qualifying students to attend a college or junior college located in Alabama; to create an Alabama Lottery Corporation to regulate and administer the lottery; to prohibit the operation of casinos; and to allow the Legislature to implement the Alabama Lottery through appropriate general law."

This description shall be followed by the following language:
