1 166439-2:n:04/09/2015:JET/agb LRS2015-1157R1 2 3 4 5 6 7 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the Commissioner of the 8 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources 9 10 sets the minimum weight requirement of shrimp which 11 are caught or taken in the territorial waters of 12 Alabama. 13 This bill would repeal that authority and would authorize the commissioner to establish areas 14 that are closed for commercial and recreational 15 harvesting of shrimp subject to certain 16 17 restrictions. 18 This bill would also allow the commissioner 19 to provide for emergency open or closed seasons for 20 the harvesting of shrimp. Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama 21 22 of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 23 24 Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general 25 law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from 26 27 becoming effective with regard to a local

1governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote2unless: it comes within one of a number of3specified exceptions; it is approved by the4affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates5funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to6the entity for the purpose.

7 The purpose or effect of this bill would be 8 to require a new or increased expenditure of local 9 funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, 10 the bill does not require approval of a local 11 governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to 12 become effective because it comes within one of the 13 specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

A BILL

To amend Section 9-12-46, Code of Alabama 1975, 19 relating to the commercial harvesting of shrimp, to authorize 20 21 the Commissioner of the Department of Conservation and Natural 22 Resources to establish areas that are closed for commercial 23 and recreational harvesting of shrimp; to allow the 24 commissioner to provide for emergency open and closed seasons 25 for the harvesting of shrimp; and in connection therewith 26 would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of 27

1	Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now
2	appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
5	Section 1. Section 9-12-46, Code of Alabama 1975, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"§9-12-46.
8	" <u>(a)</u> The Commissioner of Conservation and Natural
9	Resources shall set by regulation the minimum weight
10	requirement of shrimp which are caught or taken from the
11	territorial waters of Alabama for commercial purposes or which
12	are brought into Alabama from waters beyond the territorial
13	jurisdiction of Alabama for commercial purposes; provided,
14	however, that such minimum weight requirement as set by
15	regulation of said Commissioner of Conservation and Natural
16	Resources shall require not more than 68 shrimp with heads
17	attached to weigh one pound and shall require not more than
18	114 headless shrimp to the pound rule areas that are closed
19	for commercial and recreational shrimping subject to the
20	restrictions provided in subsection (b).
21	"It shall be unlawful for any person, firm,
22	corporation or association to sell, offer for sale or have in
23	possession for sale for commercial purposes any shrimp which
24	require more in number to weigh one pound than the number per
25	pound as set by regulation of the Commissioner of Conservation
26	and Natural Resources.

1	"(b)(1) All inside waters, as defined by rules
2	adopted by the Commissioner of the Department of Conservation
3	and Natural Resources, shall be closed to all commercial and
4	recreational shrimping from 6:00 a.m., May 1, to 6:00 a.m.,
5	June 1 of each year.
6	" <u>(2) The portion of Mobile Bay that lies within the</u>
7	described area from Mayday Park to Great Point Clear, as
8	defined by rule, shall be closed to commercial and
9	recreational shrimping from 6:00 a.m., August 15, until 6:00
10	a.m. October 1 of each year.
11	"(c) The commissioner may provide for emergency open
12	or closed seasons for the taking of shrimp due to biological,
13	technical, or environmental factors or for the protection of
14	public health and welfare.
15	" <u>(d)</u> Any person, firm, corporation or association
16	who or which violates any of the provisions of this section
17	shall be guilty of a <u>Class C</u> misdemeanor and, upon conviction,
18	shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more
19	than \$100.00 for each offense, punishable as provided by law.
20	" <u>(e)</u> Nothing in this section shall be construed to
21	apply to shrimp which are used solely as bait."
22	Section 2. Although this bill would have as its
23	purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased
24	expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further
25	requirements and application under Amendment 621, now
26	appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of
27	the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the

bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an
existing crime.

3 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 4 first day of the third month following its passage and 5 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
