2 ENROLLED, An Act,

3 Relating to Sumter County; to amend Act 83-480,
4 (Acts 1983, p. 672), as amended, which levies fees on the
5 disposal of certain wastes and distributes the proceeds of the
6 fees; to amend Sections 2 and 4 of the act; to provide further
7 for the fees and the distributions of the proceeds of the
8 fees; and to repeal conflicting local laws, including
9 specifically Act 90-612, (Acts 1990, p. 1124), as amended by
10 Act 94-700, (Acts 1994, p. 1350).

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

12 Section 1. Sections 2 and 4 of Act 83-480, (Acts
13 1983, p. 672), as amended, are hereby further amended to read
14 as follows:

15 "Section 2. There is hereby levied a fee to be paid
16 by each operator of a commercial site for the disposal of
17 hazardous waste in the amount of three dollars and fifty cents
18 (\$3.50) per ton. It is the intent of this law to cover only
19 material that is land filled at the site. It shall exclude any
20 material which is stored, transshipped, recycled, or processed
21 for other use.

22 "Section 4. (a) The proceeds of the fees generated
23 by this act and Section 22-30B-2, Code of Alabama 1975, shall
24 first be distributed in monthly installments, as follows:

2 "(c) (1) All recipients of funds pursuant to this
3 section must be a nonprofit or governmental entity and must
4 provide an annual financial report to the Chair of the Sumter
5 County Commission and the Sumter County legislative
6 delegation. The delegation may also adopt rules for and
7 require the application of additional financial assurances of
8 an entity, including the requirement of periodic audits of the
9 entities.

10 "(2) If any nonprofit receiving payment pursuant to
11 this section is dissolved or loses its nonprofit status, its
12 distributive share shall be held in trust by the Sumter County
13 Commission for up to one fiscal quarter and shall be
14 redistributed by resolution to one or more nonprofit or
15 governmental entities named in subsection (a) or (b)."

16 Section 2. All laws or parts of law in conflict with
17 this act are repealed and replaced by this act and Act 90-612,
18 (Acts 1990, p. 1124), 1990 Regular Session, as amended by Act
19 94-700, (Acts 1994, p. 1354), 1994 Regular Session, is hereby
20 specifically repealed.

21 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
22 first day of the first month following its passage and
23 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
