1	TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT
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4	Relating to Alabama State University; to amend
5	Sections 16-50-20, 16-50-26, and 16-50-28, Code of Alabama
6	1975; to increase the membership of the board of trustees by
7	three at-large members; to decrease term lengths from 12 to 6
8	years; to limit members to two six-year terms; to create and
9	provide for the operation of a nominating committee; to
10	provide a procedure for holding emergency meetings of the
11	board; to allow members of the board to participate in
12	meetings by electronic means; and to provide further for the
13	compensation of members.
14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
15	Section 1. Sections 16-50-20, 16-50-26, and 16-50-28
16	of the Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
17	"§16-50-20.
18	"(a) There is hereby created a Board of Trustees for
19	Alabama State University, the state educational institution at
20	Montgomery, Alabama. The board of trustees shall consist of
21	two members from the congressional district in which the
22	institution is located and one member from each of the other
23	congressional districts in the state as constituted on October
24	6, 1975, and who shall reside in that district, four members
25	from the state at large who shall reside in different

districts, three at-large members who may be selected from

outside the state, and the Governor, who shall be ex officio

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1 president of the board. Except for a trustee at large, the 2 position of any trustee shall be vacated at such time as he or she shall cease to reside in the district from which he or she 3 4 was appointed. The trustees shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, in 5 6 such manner that the membership shall consist of at least a 7 majority who are alumni and who have received a bachelor's degree from the said university; at least one-half of the 8 9 board shall be from the prevailing minority population of the 10 state according to the last or any succeeding federal census. 11 Trustees shall hold office for staggered terms of three, six, 12 nine and 12 years with an equal number appointed to like 13 terms, such period of terms designated by the appointing 14 authority, with one-fourth to expire every three years, or 15 until their successors are appointed. Beginning in 2015, the board shall be divided into three groups, so that 16 17 reappointments may be made each two years. In 2015, three members shall be appointed for terms of two years, three 18 members shall be appointed for terms of four years, and three 19 members shall be appointed for terms of six years. Thereafter, 20 21 all successor members shall be appointed for six-year terms. 22 All appointments shall be effective until adversely acted upon 23 by the Senate. Provided, however, no trustee who is currently serving on the board or whose term has just expired, who has 24 25 been previously confirmed by the Senate, shall be required to be reconfirmed for the new term under this section, once 26 27 appointed by the Governor. A Commencing on the effective date

of the act amending this subsection, no member may be appointed to serve a second term of 12 years, but and no member shall be appointed to serve as trustee for more than a total of two six-year terms. The first members, however, shall be eligible to serve for two full additional terms in addition to their initial terms. No trustee shall receive any pay or emolument other than his or her actual expenses incurred in the discharge of his or her duties as such. No member of the governing board or employee or student of any public postsecondary education institution, no elected or appointed official having the power of review of the Alabama State University budget, other than the Governor and no employee of the State of Alabama shall be eligible to serve on the board. No member shall serve past September 30 following his or her seventieth birthday.

"(b) No trustee who is serving on the said board on April 30, 1986, shall lose his or her seat because of this section; provided, however, the Governor may re-designate the period of the term of these members so as to conform to the provisions of subsection (a).

"(c) (1) On or after July 1, 2015, each trustee shall be appointed by the Governor from a list of three persons

nominated by a nominating committee. The nominating committee shall consist of the following members:

"a. One member of the board as elected by the membership of the board.

Т	b. One member of the faculty senate as selected	
2	jointly by the faculty senate and the staff senate and	
3	certified to the committee by the president of the faculty	
4	senate and the president of the staff senate.	
5	"c. The president of the student government	
6	association.	
7	"d. One member of the Montgomery County Senate	
8	Legislative Delegation, as selected by the delegation.	
9	"e. One member of the Montgomery County House of

12	"f. The president of the national alumni	
13	association, or his or her designee.	
14	"g. A community representative as selected by the

16	"(2) Where applicable, members of the nominating	
17	committee shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing	
18	authority for a period of at least one year.	
19	"(3) Thirty days before the expiration of the term	
20	of a board member, or within 20 days following the creation of	
21	a vacancy in a term of office by death, resignation, or other	
22	cause, the president pro tempore of the board shall call a	
23	meeting of the nominating committee, giving at least 10 days'	
24	notice. The nominating committee, by majority vote of those	
25	present at the meeting, shall nominate to the Governor the	
26	names of three individuals who are qualified pursuant to	
27	subsection (a) to fill the respective position on the board.	

The Governor shall appoint one of the nominated persons to the board by and with the advice and consent of the Senate. If the appointment is made by the Governor while the Legislature is not in session, the name of the appointee of the Governor shall be submitted to the Senate not later than the third legislative day following the reconvening of the Legislature. If the appointment is made by the Governor while the Legislature is in session, the name of the appointee shall be submitted to the Senate not later than the next legislative day following the date of the appointment.

"(4)a. If the vacancy on the board is caused by the expiration of the term of a trustee who has served for less than the maximum 12 years of service on the board, the vacating trustee shall continue to serve on the board until his or her successor is confirmed by the Senate. If the holdover trustee is reappointed to the board, the term of office for which he or she is reappointed shall be effective retroactive to the date of the expiration of the previous term. If a new trustee is appointed pursuant to this paragraph, the term of office for which he or she is appointed shall be effective retroactive to the date of the expiration of the previous term.

"b. If the vacancy on the board is caused by death, resignation, or the expiration of the term of a trustee who has served for the maximum 12 years of service on the board, the position on the board shall remain vacant until the name of an appointee is submitted by the Governor to the Senate. If

the appointee is not confirmed or rejected by the Senate during the session in which his or her name is submitted, the appointee shall nevertheless continue to serve in the position on the board until the next session of the Legislature, during which his or her name shall be resubmitted for confirmation. If an appointee is confirmed by the Senate, the term of office for which he or she is appointed pursuant to this paragraph shall be effective retroactive to the date the vacancy was created on the board, for the remainder of the unexpired term if the vacancy was created by death or resignation, or for the entire term if the vacancy was created by the expiration of the previous term. If an appointee is rejected by the Senate, the position on the board shall remain vacant as the nominating and appointing procedure provided in this subsection begins anew and until an appointment is made and confirmed by the Senate. If a trustee is appointed to fill an unexpired term of less than three years, the time shall not be counted toward the maximum 12 years of service. "(5) If the nominating committee fails to submit a

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"(5) If the nominating committee fails to submit a list of nominees to the Governor within 30 days after a vacancy occurs due to expiration of term, death, resignation, or any other cause, the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, may appoint an otherwise qualified trustee to the board, notwithstanding the absence of such nominations.

"(d) The board shall provide for the conduct of annual training sessions for trustees regarding the fiduciary

responsibility of a trustee to the university and any other
topic deemed appropriate by the board.

"The first meeting of the Board of Trustees of Alabama State University after all members have been appointed shall be upon the call of the Governor. The board shall hold regular meetings on the first Thursdays in May and November at the university unless the board shall, in regular session, shall determine to hold its meetings at some other time and place. The regular May meeting shall be the regular annual meeting. Special meetings of the board may be assembled by either one of the two methods outlined as follows:

- "(1) Special meetings of the board may be called by the Governor. In calling such special meetings the Governor shall mail a written notice to each trustee, naming the time and place thereof, at least 10 days in advance of the date of such meetings.
- "(2) Upon the application in writing of any four members of the board, the Governor shall call a special meeting, naming the time and place thereof and causing notices to be issued in writing to the several members of the board. Such meetings shall not be held on a date less than 10 days subsequent to the notices from the Governor.
- "(3) An emergency meeting of the board may be called when circumstances exist that are deemed by the Governor, by the president pro tempore of the board, or by three members of the board to present a risk to personal health, safety, or

property or to the operation of the university. The three 1 board members shall communicate their request for an emergency 2 meeting to the Governor or to the president pro tempore of the 3 4 board by the most expedient means available to them. Notice of an emergency meeting shall be given at least 72 hours before 5 the time the emergency meeting is to commence unless the 6 7 circumstances of the emergency require the meeting to convene 8 sooner.

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"(4) Members of the board may participate in a meeting of the board or any committee of the board by means of telephone conference, video conference, or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting may hear each other at the same time. Participation by such means shall constitute presence in person at a meeting for all purposes. However, a majority of a quorum of the members of the board, or, in the event of a meeting of only the executive committee, a majority of a quorum of the executive committee of the board shall be physically present at the location noticed and called for the meeting in order to conduct any business or deliberation. Members of the board and any committees of the board may not utilize electronic communications except as in compliance with the Alabama Open Meetings Act. Except for emergency meetings, notice of board meetings shall be provided in accordance with the Alabama Open Meetings Act and telephone or video conference or similar communications equipment shall also

1	allow members of the public the opportunity to simultaneously
2	listen to or observe such meetings.

4	"The certificate of the president of the board or,
5	in his or her absence, of the president pro tempore,
6	countersigned by the secretary, shall entitle the several
7	trustees to the payment of their actual expenses incurred in
8	the discharge of their duties as trustees in conformity with
9	regulations governing travel expenses of state officials."
10	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
11	first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
