The amendment 12 13 would also create the Lottery Trust Fund and the 14 Alabama Lottery Corporation to implement and 15 regulate the operation of the lottery. 16 The amendment provides for net proceeds from 17 the lottery to be deposited in the Lottery Trust 18 Fund and allocates one-half of the Lottery Trust 19 Fund for scholarships for qualifying students to 20 attend a college or junior college located in Alabama and one-half for the state General Fund. 21 22 The amendment requires the Legislature to 23 enact general legislation to provide for the 24 administration, operation, and regulation of the 25 lottery and powers, duties, and authority of the 26 Alabama Lottery Corporation. 27

"Section 65.

"PART I.

"The Except as provided in Part II of this section, 3 4 the Legislature shall have no power to authorize lotteries or gift enterprises for any purposes, and shall pass laws to 5 6 prohibit the sale in this state of lottery or gift enterprise 7 tickets, or tickets in any scheme in the nature of a lottery; and all acts, or parts of acts heretofore passed by the 8 Legislature of this state, authorizing a lottery or lotteries, 9 10 and all acts amendatory thereof, or supplemental thereto, are 11 hereby avoided. 12 "PART II. 13 "(a) Establishment of an Alabama Lottery. 14 "The Alabama Lottery is created. The Legislature, by

15 <u>general law, shall provide for the administration, operation,</u>
16 <u>and regulation of the Alabama Lottery.</u>

"(b) Lottery Trust Fund.

"The proceeds from the Alabama Lottery shall be 18 applied first to the payment of the expenses of administering 19 and operating the Alabama Lottery, including, without 20 21 limitation, the payment of all prizes, without any further 22 appropriation required by law, and the balance of such 23 proceeds remaining after such payments shall be deposited, as provided by general law, and held in a special, separate 24 25 account in the State Treasury hereby created and designated the "Lottery Trust Fund" until such time as such proceeds are 26 27 disbursed pursuant to this amendment.

1	" <u>(c) Alabama Lottery Corporation.</u>
2	"The administration of the Alabama Lottery shall be
3	vested in a corporation hereby created and designated the
4	"Alabama Lottery Corporation." The duties, powers, authority,
5	and composition of the Alabama Lottery Corporation shall be
6	provided by general law.
7	"(d) Allocations and Disbursements.
8	"(1) Fifty percent of the monies in the Lottery
9	Trust Fund shall be allocated exclusively to provide
10	scholarships to citizens of Alabama who are A/B Honor Roll
11	students to attend universities, colleges, and junior,
12	technical, or community colleges located in Alabama.
13	"(2) Fifty percent of the monies in the Lottery
14	Trust Fund shall be allocated to the state General Fund.
15	"(e) Agreements with other Jurisdictions.
16	"The Alabama Lottery Corporation may enter into
17	reciprocal agreements with other jurisdictions for the

4 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 5 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 6 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 7 following description on the proposed constitutional 8 amendment:

"Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 9 10 Alabama of 1901, to establish an Alabama Lottery, to 11 distribute net lottery proceeds to provide scholarships for 12 qualifying students to attend a college or junior college located in Alabama and to the state General Fund; to create an 13 14 Alabama Lottery Corporation to regulate and administer the lottery; and to require the Legislature to provide for 15 operation of the Alabama Lottery and the Alabama Lottery 16 Corporation through appropriate general law." 17
