8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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9 Section 1. The following amendment to the 10 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and 11 shall become valid as part thereof, effective January 1, 2017, 12 following approval by a majority of the qualified electors 13 voting thereon in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 14 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

16 On and after the effective date of this provision, 17 no limitation on the appropriation or spending of state revenues contained in the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as 18 amended, shall be effective nor shall any general or local act 19 in existence on the effective date of this provision or 20 21 thereafter direct that any state revenue be appropriated or 22 spent in a particular manner. Notwithstanding any other 23 provision of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, following 24 the ratification of this provision, all appropriations for the 25 ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial departments of the state, for interest on the public debt and 26

3 Section 2. The appropriate election official shall
4 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional
5 amendment on the election ballot and shall set the following
6 description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed

8 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 9 Alabama of 1901, to become effective January 1, 2017, to 10 disallow any limitation on the appropriation or spending of 11 state revenues and to allow for a unified appropriations bill. 12 "Proposed by Act _____"

13This description shall be followed by the following14language:
