(3) Happy holidays. 8 (b) Except as provided by subsection (c), a school 9 10 district may display on school property scenes or symbols 11 associated with traditional winter celebrations, including a 12 menorah or a Christmas image such as a nativity scene or 13 Christmas tree, if the display includes a scene or symbol of 14 one or more of the following: 15 (1) More than one religion. (2) One religion and at least one secular scene or 16 17 symbol. (c) A display relating to a traditional winter 18 celebration may not include a message that encourages 19

20 adherence to a particular religious belief.

21 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 22 first day of the third month following its passage and 23 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
