24	Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding Sections 32-6-64,
25	32-6-65, 32-6-67, and 32-6-68 of the Code of Alabama 1975,
26	upon application to the judge of probate, license commissioner
27	or other issuing official, compliance with motor vehicle

registration and licensing laws, payment of regular fees required by law for license tags or plates, and payment of an annual additional fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) for private passenger or pleasure motor vehicles, owners of motor vehicles who are residents of Alabama and are recipients of the Bronze Star shall be issued distinctive "Bronze Star" license tags or plates. These tags or plates shall be valid for five years, and may then be replaced with either conventional or new distinctive tags or plates. An applicant for a "Bronze Star" license plate shall submit his or her DD Form 214 to the license issuing official as proof that he or she is the recipient of a Bronze Star.

- (b) Payment of required motor vehicle license fees and taxes for the years during which a new vehicle license plate or tag is not issued shall be evidenced as provided in Section 32-6-63 of the Code of Alabama 1975.
- (c) The license plate shall be designed by the Department of Veterans Affairs and approved by the Department of Revenue.
- (d) The tags or plates shall be issued, printed, and processed like other distinctive plates provided in this chapter.
- (e) The net proceeds of the additional revenues derived from sales of the distinctive plates, less administrative costs including the costs of production incurred by the Department of Revenue in producing the plates, shall be distributed by each judge of probate or license

commissioner to the state Comptroller. The state Comptroller
shall distribute the proceeds into the Alabama Veterans'

Assistance Fund in the State Treasury.

Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict
with this act are repealed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
