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To amend Section 25-4-73, Code of Alabama 1975,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 25-4-73, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§25-4-73.

- "(a) Each eligible individual who is totally unemployed or partially unemployed in any week beginning on or after July 3, 1983, shall be paid with respect to such week a benefit in an amount equal to his or her weekly benefit amount, less that part of the wages, if any, payable to him or her with respect to such week which is in excess of fifteen dollars (\$15) one third of the weekly benefit amount. Such benefit, if not a multiple of one dollar (\$1), shall be computed to the nearest multiple of one dollar (\$1).
- "(b) With respect to weeks beginning prior to January 1, 1989, each eligible individual shall be paid with respect to such week as was provided in this section prior to such date.
- "(c) With respect to benefit years effective on or after August 1, 2012, an individual shall serve a one-week

waiting period with no benefits payable during the first
compensable week within a benefit year. The waiting week shall
not be counted as a week of unemployment for the purposes of
this section."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
first day of the third month following its passage and
approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
