1 164945-1:n:02/26/2015:LLR/cj LRS2015-739 2 3 4 5 6 7 SYNOPSIS: This bill would require employers, 8 companies, or individuals who submit bids for 9 10 certain public works projects and all disaster 11 response, recovery, and restoration projects that 12 utilize funds received by state or local 13 governmental entities resulting from a disaster requiring federal oversight to certify that they 14 will comply with the provisions of this act if they 15 16 are awarded such contracts. 17 This bill would require the employers, 18 companies, or individuals to submit to the agency 19 or governing authority that solicited the bid and 20 the Alabama Department of Labor a staffing plan 21 within seven days after the notice of award of the 22 contract. 23 This bill would provide that from the date 24 written notice of the contract award is received 25 and until 10 business days after the receipt of the staffing plan by the Alabama Department of Labor, 26 27 the employers, companies, or individuals and any

subcontractors shall not hire any new personnel to 1 2 fill vacant staff positions necessary for the public works projects and all disaster response, 3 4 recovery, and restoration projects except residents 5 of the State of Alabama who can verify residency or those qualified individuals who are submitted by 6 7 the Alabama Department of Labor. This bill would provide that the contract 8 9 award shall be vacated if the employers, companies, 10 or individuals fail to comply with this bill. 11 12 A BILL 13 TO BE ENTITLED 14 AN ACT 15 16 Relating to public contracts; to require employers, 17 companies, or individuals who submit bids for certain public works projects and all disaster response, recovery, and 18 restoration projects that utilize funds received by state or 19 local governmental entities resulting from a disaster 20 21 requiring federal oversight to certify that they will comply 22 with the provisions of this act if they are awarded such 23 contracts; to require the employers, companies, or individuals 24 to submit to the agency or governing authority that solicited 25 the bid and the Alabama Department of Labor, a staffing plan 26 within seven days after the notice of award of the contract; 27 to provide that from the date written notice of the contract

1 award is received and until 10 business days after the receipt 2 of the staffing plan by the Alabama Department of Labor the employers, companies, or individuals and any subcontractors 3 shall not hire any new personnel to fill vacant staff 4 positions necessary for the public works projects and all 5 6 disaster response, recovery, and restoration projects except 7 residents of the State of Alabama who can verify residency or those qualified individuals who are submitted by the Alabama 8 Department of Labor; and to provide that the contract award 9 10 shall be vacated if the employers, companies, or individuals fail to comply with this bill. 11

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

13 Section 1. (a) All public works projects, disaster 14 response, recovery, and restoration projects utilizing funds 15 received by state or local governmental entities resulting from a disaster requiring federal oversight, including 16 17 damages, penalties, fines, or supplemental projects paid or financed by responsible parties pursuant to a court order, 18 negotiated settlement, or other instrument, including under 19 any law distributing such fines and penalties including the 20 21 federal Stafford Act, the Resources and Ecosystems 22 Sustainability, Tourist Opportunities and Revived Economy of 23 the Gulf Coast Act of 2011 (R.E.S.T.O.R.E.), the Oil Pollution 24 Act of 1990 or the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, Clean 25 Water Act, Clean Air Act, Environmental Justice or similar 26 legislation, shall be subject to the staffing policies 27 established by this act.

1 (b) Employers, companies, or individuals submitting 2 bids for public works projects and all disaster response, recovery, and restoration projects that involve an expenditure 3 4 of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) or more and that are financed, in whole or in part, through the use of funds 5 described in subsection (a) of this section shall submit with 6 7 their bid a certification that they will comply with the provisions of this section if they are awarded a contract. A 8 staffing plan, which shall include the following, which must 9 10 be submitted with the bid:

(1) Job descriptions involved in the project.

12 (2) The skill level of the jobs involved in the13 project.

14 (3) Wage information on the jobs involved in the15 project.

16 (4) The number of vacant positions that the 17 employers, companies, or individuals and any subcontractor 18 need to fill, specifying how many positions will be filled 19 with in-state residents.

(5) How the employers, companies, or individuals and
 any subcontractor will recruit low-wage, under-employed and
 unemployed Alabama residents for job vacancies or placements.

(6) Detail how employers utilize all resources
 provided by the Alabama Department of Labor to find employees
 including use of non-profit and community based organizations.

(7) Pledge that the employers, companies, or
 individuals will use Alabama residents throughout the life of
 the contract.

4 Section 2. (a) The Alabama Department of Labor shall develop a quarterly report that tracks data received from 5 6 employers, companies, or individuals. Employers, companies, or 7 individuals shall cooperate with the Alabama Department of Labor to accumulate relevant data. Collected data and reports 8 9 are intended solely to allow the Alabama Department of Labor 10 to improve workforce training programs, tailoring trainings to disaster response, recovery, and restoration needs and hiring 11 12 trends in Alabama. If local, state, and federal funding is 13 made available due to the disaster, funds shall be set aside 14 for the Alabama Department of Labor to administer, provide intermediary support via career centers and refer workers to 15 16 tailored trainings in disaster response, recovery, 17 restoration, and capacity building.

(b) The Alabama Department of Labor shall use the
above funding to develop and maintain a list of qualified
citizens who shall be eligible for employment under this act.
The list shall be made available through the Alabama
Department of Labor.

23 Section 3. This act shall become effective 24 immediately following its passage and approval by the 25 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
