motor vehicles, owners of motor vehicles who are residents of Alabama shall be issued distinctive "In God We Trust" license tags or plates. In those years in which a revalidation decal only is issued, the owner shall pay the regular license fee for tags as provided by law. These tags or plates shall be valid for five years, and may then be replaced with either conventional or new "In God We Trust" tags or plates.

8 (b) Payment of required license fees and taxes for 9 the years during which a new tag or plate is not issued shall 10 be evidenced as provided in Section 32-6-63, Code of Alabama 11 1975.

12 (c) The "In God We Trust" license plate shall be13 designed by the Department of Revenue.

(d) The tags or plates shall be issued, printed, and
processed like other distinctive plates provided in Chapter 6
of Title 32, Code of Alabama 1975.

17 Section 2. This act shall become effective on 18 October 1, 2016, following its passage and approval by the 19 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
