17	Section 1. Section 34-25A-7.1 is added to the Code
18	of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:
19	§34-25A-7.1.
20	(a) In addition to the other powers of the board,
21	the State Board of Prosthetists and Orthotists shall have all
22	powers necessary and proper to carry out its official duties,
23	including, but not limited to, the authority to issue
24	subpoenas and compel the attendance of witnesses and the
25	production of all necessary papers, records, documentary
26	evidence and materials, or other evidence in matters pending
27	before the board or to investigate complaints concerning the

practice of prosthetics and orthotics. Any subpoena issued pursuant to this section shall be signed by the chair of the board or by the executive officer of the board and may be served by any sheriff, by the executive officer of the board, or by any other person authorized to serve a subpoena under the Alabama Rules of Civil Procedure. Any subpoena issued pursuant to this section shall be enforced by the circuit court upon application of the board or its executive officer in the same manner as the issuance of a subpoena by the circuit court.

- (b) The board, by rule, may further provide for the enforcement and other disciplinary action, including civil fines, by the board against any licensee of the board or any other person engaged in the practice of prosthetics and orthotics who fails to comply with any subpoena of the board issued pursuant to this section.
- (c) Subsection (a) is supplemental to the provisions of subsection (c) of Section 41-22-12, relating to the issuance of subpoenas in a contested case under the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act.
- (d) Nothing in this section shall apply to a hospital or an authorized health care practitioner, or to a person employed by, or contracted with, a hospital or an authorized health care provider.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
