4 Section 1. (a) For purposes of this act, the term association means an association or unit owners association, 5 as defined in Section 35-8A-103 of the Code of Alabama 1975, 6 7 an association as defined in Section 35-8-2 of the Code of Alabama 1975, or a nonprofit or cooperative membership 8 organization composed exclusively of owners of mobile homes, 9 10 manufactured housing, time shares, camping resort interests, 11 or other interests in real property that is responsible for 12 the maintenance, improvements, services, or expenses related 13 to real property that is owned, used, or enjoyed in common by 14 the members of the association.

(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an association may not restrict the design of a real estate sign for the sale of property located within the boundary of the association if the sign is less than two feet wide and three feet in height.

(c) Any owner of any real estate who is injured by a
violation of this act by an association may bring a cause of
action against the association for recovery of damages.

23 Section 2. This act shall become effective 24 immediately following its passage and approval by the 25 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
