8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, an alcoholic beverage
9 license may be transferred once in any license year
10 from one location to another upon approval by the
11 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

12 This bill would permit an alcoholic beverage
13 licensee who holds a valid license to sell
14 alcoholic beverages, including beer in unopened
15 containers for off-premises consumption, and is
16 current on any fees levied by the Alcoholic
17 Beverage Control Board to move from one location to
18 another, without having to pay an additional fee,
19 reapply for a license, or be re-inspected by the
20 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board if the local
21 governing jurisdiction in which the licensee
22 relocates approves the relocation.

1 Relating to the regulation of alcoholic beverages;
2 to permit an alcoholic beverage licensee who holds a valid
3 license to sell alcoholic beverages, including beer in
4 unopened containers for off-premises consumption, and is
5 current on any fees levied by the Alcoholic Beverage Control
6 Board to move from one location to another, without having to
7 pay an additional fee, reapply for a license, or be
8 re-inspected by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board if the
9 local governing jurisdiction in which the licensee relocates
10 approves the relocation.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

12 Section 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law, an
13 alcoholic beverage licensee who holds a valid license to sell
14 alcoholic beverages, including beer in unopened containers for
15 off-premises consumption, and is current on any fees levied by
16 the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board may move from one
17 location to another, without having to pay an additional fee,
18 reapply for a license, or be re-inspected by the Alcoholic
19 Beverage Control Board if the local governing jurisdiction in
20 which the licensee relocates approves the relocation

21 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
22 first day of the third month following its passage and
23 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
