20	"(a) The Legislature of the State of Alabama finds
21	the following:
22	"(1) Early defibrillation may sustain the life and
23	temporarily stabilize a person in cardiac arrest, thus helping
24	to preserve the Alabama family.
25	"(2) The American Heart Association estimates that
26	more than 350,000 Americans die each year from out of hospital
27	sudden cardiac arrest, and 20,000 deaths may be prevented each

1	year if automated external defibrillators were more widely			
2	<del>available.</del>			
3	"(b) It is the intent of the Legislature that an			
4	automated external defibrillator may be used for the purpose			
5	of saving the life of another person in cardiac arrest.			
6	" $\frac{(c)}{(a)}$ As used in Section 6-5-332, the term			
7	"automated external defibrillator" or "AED" means a medical			
8	device heart monitor and defibrillator that meets all of the			
9	following specifications:			
10	"(1) Has received approval of its pre-market			
11	notification filed pursuant to Section 360 (k), Title 21 of			
12	the United States Code from the United States Food and Drug			
13	Administration Is commercially distributed in accordance with			
14	the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act (21 U.S.C. Section			
15	301, et seq.).			
16	"(2) Is capable of recognizing the presence or			
17	absence of ventricular fibrillation or rapid ventricular			
18	tachycardia and is capable of determining, without			
19	intervention by an operator, whether defibrillation should be			
20	performed.			
21	"(3) Upon determining that defibrillation should be			
22	performed, <u>semiautomatically or</u> automatically charges and

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1	"(1) That expected defibrillator users <del>receive</del>
2	appropriate training in an American Heart Association,
3	American Red Cross, or other nationally recognized
4	cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) course and AED, or an

6	successfully complete a course in automated external
7	defibrillation and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) that is
8	offered or approved by a nationally recognized organization
9	and includes instruction on psychomotor skills and national
10	evidence-based emergency cardiovascular guidelines that are
11	current.

"(2) That the defibrillator is maintained and tested according to the manufacturer's operational guidelines.

- "(3) That there is involvement of a licensed physician or medical authority in the site's AED program to ensure compliance with training, notification, and maintenance.
- "(4) That any person who renders emergency care or treatment of a person in cardiac arrest by using an AED activates the emergency medical services system as soon as possible.
- "(5) That each manufacturer, wholesale supplier, or retailer of an AED notifies purchasers of AED's intended for use in the State of Alabama of the requirements of this section.

1	"(c) Each manufacturer shall provide in-service
2	training materials on the AED use and operation to each entity
3	who acquires the AED.
4	" <del>(e)</del> (d) A person or entity who acquires an automated
5	external defibrillator shall notify the local emergency
6	communications center or dispatch center of the existing
7	location and type of AED distributor of the AED if any change
8	of ownership of the AED occurs.
9	"(f)(e) This section shall not apply to an
10	individual using an AED in an emergency setting if that
11	individual is acting as a good samaritan pursuant to Section
