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SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the members of the Board 8 of Trustees for the Alabama Agricultural and 9 10 Mechanical University are appointed by the Governor 11 pursuant to a process utilizing a nominating 12 committee and the president of the university, who 13 is appointed by the board, is responsible for 14 appointing, removing, fixing the compensation of, and defining the duties of instructors; regulating, 15 altering, and modifying the organization of the 16 17 university, subject to review and concurrence of 18 board; prescribing courses of instruction within 19 academic programs approved by the board; and 20 conferring academic degrees and honorary degrees 21 upon recommendation of the faculty.

This bill would substantially revise the composition of the nominating committee and the process for nominating, appointing, and confirming members of the board.

26This bill would transfer those27responsibilities of the president relating to

1 instructors, the organization of the university, 2 courses of instruction, and the conferring of academic and honorary degrees from the president to 3 4 the board and would repeal a provision providing for removal of a trustee for a conflict of 5 interest. 6 7 This bill would also provide that trustees 8 receive payment of actual expenses incurred in the 9 discharge of their duties to the board. 10 11 A BTTT 12 TO BE ENTITLED 13 AN ACT 14 To amend Sections 16-49-20, 16-49-23, and 16-49-28, 15 Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the Board of Trustees for 16 17 Alabama Agricultural and Mechanical University; to revise the composition of the nominating committee; and to revise the 18 process for nominating, appointing, and confirming members of 19 20 the board; to transfer certain responsibilities of the 21 president of the university to the board; and to provide that 22 trustees receive payment of actual expenses incurred in the 23 discharge of their duties to the board. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 24 Section 1. Sections 16-49-20, 16-49-23, and 16-49-28 25 26 of the Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: 27 "§16-49-20.

1 "(a)(1) There is created a Board of Trustees for 2 Alabama Agricultural and Mechanical University, a state land-grant educational institution at Huntsville. The 3 4 membership of the board shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic 5 diversity of the state. The board of trustees shall consist of 6 7 12 members, two members who shall reside in the congressional district in which the institution is situated; one member 8 9 shall reside in each of the remaining congressional districts in the state as constituted on September 5, 1975 the most 10 recent federal decennial census, and shall be a bona fide 11 12 resident and qualified elector of that district, with a 13 verifiable physical presence in that district, during the 14 entire term of office; three at-large members who may be 15 selected from outside the state; and the Governor, who shall be ex officio president of the board. The president of the 16 17 student government association and the president of the faculty senate shall be ex officio nonvoting members of the 18 board. If a trustee appointed from a congressional district 19 20 ceases to be a bona fide resident and qualified elector of the 21 district from which appointed, or ceases to have a verifiable 22 physical presence in that district, the trustee shall vacate 23 his or her office.

"(2) Before June 9, 2011, the trustees shall be
appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent
of the Senate.

"(3) The membership shall include at least three
 <u>seven</u> members who have earned a degree from Alabama
 Agricultural and Mechanical University.

4 "(4) Except for the first trustees appointed,
5 trustees shall hold office for a term of six years. No member
6 presently serving as of January 1989 shall have his or her
7 current term of office terminated because of these provisions.

8 "(5) All appointments shall be effective upon 9 confirmation by the Senate.

10 "(6) The board shall be divided into three classes 11 so that at least one third shall be appointed biennially. Of 12 the first members appointed to the board, three shall be 13 designated by the Governor to serve until January 31, 1978; 14 four until January 31, 1980; and four to serve until January 15 31, 1982.

"(7) A trustee may be appointed to serve a second 16 17 term of six years, but no trustee shall be appointed to serve more than a total of 12 years, except as otherwise provided in 18 19 paragraph b. of subdivision (4) of subsection (b). Any trustee 20 serving on the board on the effective date of the act amending 21 this subdivision, who has served more than two terms of 22 office, or more than a total of 12 years, shall vacate his or 23 her office on the effective date of the act amending this 24 subdivision.

"(8) No trustee shall receive any pay or emolument
other than his or her actual expenses incurred in the
discharge of his or her duties.

1 "(9) No member of the governing board, no officer or 2 employee or student of any public postsecondary educational institution, and no elected or appointed official having the 3 4 power of review of the Alabama Agricultural and Mechanical University budget, other than the Governor, shall be eligible 5 to serve on the board of trustees. 6 7 "(b)(1) On or after June 9, 2011 the effective date of the act amending this subdivision, each trustee shall be 8 appointed by the Governor from a list of three persons 9 nominated by a nominating committee. The nominating committee 10 shall consist of the following members: 11 "a. One member of the board of trustees as elected 12 13 by the membership of the board of trustees. "b. One member as selected jointly by the faculty 14 senate and the staff senate and certified to the committee by 15 the president of the faculty senate and the president of the 16 17 staff senate. "c. The president of the student government 18 association. 19 "d. The President of the Huntsville-Madison County 20 21 Chamber of Commerce, or his or her designee. "e. One member of the Madison County Legislative 22 23 Delegation, as selected by the delegation. 24 "f. The president of the national alumni 25 association, or his or her designee. 26 "g. A community representative as selected by the 27 other members of the nominating committee.

1 "(2) Where applicable, members of the nominating 2 committee shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority for a period of at least one year. 3 4 "(3) Thirty days before the expiration of the term of a board member, or within 20 days following the creation of 5 a vacancy in a term of office by death, resignation, or other 6 7 cause, the president pro tempore of the board of trustees shall call a meeting of the nominating committee, giving at 8 9 least 10 days' notice. The nominating committee, by majority vote of those present at the meeting, shall nominate to the 10 Governor the names of three individuals who are qualified 11 12 pursuant to subsection (a) to fill the respective position on 13 the board of trustees. The Governor shall appoint one of the 14 nominated persons to the board by and with the advice and 15 consent of the Senate. If the appointment is made by the 16 Governor while the Legislature is not in session, the name of 17 the appointee of the Governor shall be submitted to the Senate not later than the third legislative day following the 18 19 reconvening of the Legislature. If the appointment is made by 20 the Governor while the Legislature is in session the name of 21 the appointee shall be submitted to the Senate not later than 22 the next legislative day following the date of the 23 appointment.

"(4)a. If the vacancy on the board is caused by the
expiration of the term of a trustee who has served for less
than the maximum 12 years on the board, the vacating trustee
shall continue to serve on the board until his or her

1 successor is confirmed by the Senate. If the holdover trustee 2 is reappointed to the board, the term of office for which he or she is reappointed shall be effective retroactive to the 3 4 date of the expiration of the previous term. If a new trustee 5 is appointed pursuant to this paragraph, the term of office for which he or she is appointed shall be effective 6 7 retroactive to the date of the expiration of the previous 8 term.

9 "b. If the vacancy on the board is caused by death, resignation, or the expiration of the term of a trustee who 10 has served for the maximum 12 years on the board, the position 11 12 on the board shall remain vacant until the name of an 13 appointee is submitted by the Governor to the Senate. If the 14 appointee is not confirmed or rejected by the Senate during 15 the session in which his or her name is submitted, the appointee shall nevertheless continue to serve in the position 16 17 on the board until the next session of the Legislature, during which his or her name shall be resubmitted for confirmation. 18 19 If an appointee is confirmed by the Senate, the term of office 20 for which he or she is appointed pursuant to this paragraph 21 shall be effective retroactive to the date the vacancy was 22 created on the board, for the remainder of the unexpired term 23 if the vacancy was created by death or resignation, or for the 24 entire term if the vacancy was created by the expiration of 25 the previous term. If an appointee is rejected by the Senate, 26 the position on the board shall remain vacant as the 27 nominating and appointing procedure provided in this

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1	subsection begins anew and until an appointment is made and
2	confirmed by the Senate. If a trustee is appointed to fill an
3	unexpired term of less than three years, the time shall not be
4	counted toward the maximum 12 years of service.
5	" (5) If the nominating committee fails to submit a
6	list of nominees to the Governor within 30 days after a
7	vacancy occurs due to expiration of term, death, resignation,
8	or any other cause, the Governor, by and with the advice and
9	consent of the Senate, may appoint an otherwise qualified
10	trustee to the board, notwithstanding the absence of such
11	nominations.
12	"a. The president pro tempore of the board, or his
13	or her designee, who shall be a member of the board.
14	"b. A member of the board as selected by the
15	membership of the board.
16	"c. The President of the Alabama Agricultural and
17	Mechanical University Alumni Association, or his or her
18	designee, who shall be a member of the board of directors of
19	the association.
20	"d. A member of the Board of Directors of the
21	Alabama Agricultural and Mechanical University Alumni
22	Association as selected by the membership of the board of
23	directors.
24	"e. The President of the Alabama Agricultural and
25	Mechanical University Foundation, or his or her designee, who
26	shall be a member of the board of directors of the foundation.

1	"f. The Chair of the Alabama Agricultural and
2	Mechanical University Faculty Senate, who shall serve as a
3	non-voting ex officio member of the nominating committee.
4	"(2) When appropriate, the nominating committee
5	shall meet to address the nomination of any of the following:
6	"a. Persons to fill an expired or soon to be expired
7	term of office of any member of the board.
8	"b. Persons to fill the remainder of a partially
9	expired term of office of a position on the board which has
10	been vacated by reason of death, resignation, or other cause.
11	"(3) The president pro tempore of the board, or his
12	or her designee, shall serve as chair of the nominating
13	committee. If the chair fails to call a meeting within 90 days
14	before the expiration of the term of a sitting board member or
15	within 30 days after the creation of a vacancy by death,
16	resignation, or other cause, a majority of the committee, in
17	writing, may call a meeting giving at least 10 days' notice.
18	In the absence of the chair, or another member designated by
19	the chair to preside, the majority of the committee shall
20	<u>choose its own chair.</u>
21	"(4) The nominating committee, by majority vote,
22	shall nominate three individuals to fill the respective
23	position on the board of trustees. The committee shall ensure
24	that potential nominees are solicited from all constituencies,
25	are inclusive, and reflect the racial, gender, and economic
26	diversity of the state. A person may not be appointed to the
27	Board of Trustees of Alabama Agricultural and Mechanical

1	University while serving on the nominating committee. The
2	nominating committee, in writing, shall immediately submit the
3	names of three nominees to the Governor. The Governor, within
4	30 days after submission of the names of three nominees, shall
5	select the name of one nominee for appointment to the board
6	and, in writing, shall notify the nominating committee of the
7	selection. If the Governor fails to select a nominee within
8	the prescribed time, the nominating committee shall select the
9	name of one of the three nominees for appointment to the
10	board.
11	" <u>(5) The Governor or the nominating committee, as</u>
12	applicable, shall submit the name of the person selected for
13	appointment to the Secretary of the Senate, who shall inform
14	the Senate of the receipt of the submission. If the Senate is
15	in regular session at that time, the submission shall be made
16	by the conclusion of the next legislative day following the
17	appointment by the Governor or the nominating committee. If
18	the Senate is not in regular session at the time of
19	appointment, the submission shall be made before the
20	commencement of the next regular session.
21	"(6) If the entire Senate, by a majority vote,
22	confirms the submission, the appointee shall immediately
23	assume office. An appointee may not begin service prior to
24	Senate confirmation. If the submission is not confirmed by the
25	entire Senate by a majority vote by the conclusion of the
26	legislative session, the submission shall be considered
27	rejected. A submission to the Senate may be withdrawn at any

1	time by the Governor, if the Governor made the submission, or
2	by the nominating committee, if the nominating committee made
3	the submission.
4	"(7) Upon the rejection or the withdrawal of a
5	submission, the nomination, appointment, and confirmation
6	process specified in this section shall commence anew. The
7	same name may be submitted to the Senate for the same position
8	on the board more than one time.
9	"(8) Upon the expiration of a term of office, a
10	member of the board of trustees shall continue to serve until
11	a successor is appointed pursuant to this section, is
12	confirmed by the entire Senate by majority vote, and assumes
13	office. If a successor is not confirmed by the conclusion of
14	the regular session in which one or more names for the
15	position were initially submitted, the former holder of the
16	position may continue to serve until a successor is appointed
17	and confirmed, but in no case shall this continuation be
18	longer than one year after completion of the term of office.
19	"(9) If a position on the board of trustees becomes
20	vacant during a term of office by reason of death,
21	resignation, or other cause, a person shall be appointed to
22	fill the remainder of the unexpired term of office pursuant to
23	the procedure provided for other appointments. The position
24	shall be considered vacant until a person is confirmed by a
25	majority vote of the entire Senate.
26	"(c) The board shall provide for the conduct of
27	annual training sessions for trustees regarding the fiduciary

responsibility of a trustee to the university and any other
 topic deemed appropriate by the board.

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"§16-49-23.

4 "The board shall not engage in activity that 5 interferes with the day-to-day operation of the university. The primary responsibility of the board of trustees is to set 6 7 policy for the university and prescribe rates of tuition and 8 fees. The board also has the power to may organize the 9 university by appointing a president, whose salary shall be 10 fixed by the board. The president shall appoint, and a corps 11 of instructors, who shall be styled the faculty of the 12 university, and such other instructors and officers as the 13 interest of the university may require, and may remove any 14 instructors or officers, fix their salaries or compensation, 15 and define the authority or duty of such instructors or 16 officers. The president may regulate, alter, and modify the 17 organization of the university, subject to review and concurrence of as determined necessary by the board. The 18 president board shall prescribe courses of instruction within 19 academic programs that have been approved by the board. The 20 21 president may, prescribe rates of tuition and fees, confer 22 academic degrees and such honorary degrees as are usually 23 conferred by institutions of similar character upon the 24 recommendation of the faculty, and do whatever else the board 25 determines is in the best interests of the university. 26 "\$16-49-28.

"The certificate of the president of the board or,
in his <u>or her</u> absence, of the president pro tempore,
countersigned by the secretary, shall entitle the several
trustees and ex officio members to the payment of their actual
expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties as such
trustees, in conformity with regulations governing travel
expenses of state officials."

8 Section 2. This act shall become effective 9 immediately following its passage and approval by the 10 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
