- b. Having exhausted his or her unemploymentbenefits.
 - (b) For all tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2016, a qualified employer subject to the requirements of this act and Sections 40-18-290 through 40-18-293 of the Code of Alabama 1975, shall be eligible for an additional nonrefundable credit against the income tax liability imposed on the state portion of the financial institution excise tax owed in an amount equal to one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each new full-time unemployed veteran hired after the passage of this act, if the majority of the duties of the business is located within the State of Alabama.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
