- Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the following words have the following meanings:
 - (1) GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY. Any department, agency, board, commission, or other entity that receives any funding from the state.
 - (2) PROFESSIONAL. Includes architects, builders, engineers, attorneys, scientists, or other persons engaged in a specialized trade.
 - (3) WORK PRODUCT. Includes all plans, designs, reports, studies, data, or other information gathered or generated as part of work performed by a professional.
 - (b) The work product produced by any professional for any governmental entity and paid for with public funds shall become the property of that governmental entity and may be used again, without modification, for any other project performed by any governmental entity within the state.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
