18	(b) It shall be unlawful for any person or business			
19	establishment to possess, purchase, sell, offer to sell, or			
20	use powdered alcohol.			
21	(c) This section shall not apply to a hospital that			
22	operates primarily for the purpose of conducting scientific			
23	research, a state institution, a pharmaceutical company, or a			
24	biotechnology company conducting bona fide research.			

L	(d) A person or business establishment who
2	unlawfully possesses, purchases, or uses a powdered alcohol
3	product shall be fined as provided in a Class A misdemeanor
1	for the first offense.

(e) A person or business establishment who unlawfully sells or offers to sell a powdered alcohol product shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor, and on a second or subsequent conviction, shall be guilty of a Class D felony.

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
