This bill would limit the number of paid 23 24 state holidays for state employees during a 25 calendar year to 13. This bill would also limit leave or 26 27 compensation for those working on a state holiday

17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. Section 1-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975, is
19	amended to read as follows:

21	"(a) Sunday, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Martin
22	Luther King, Jr.'s birthday, Robert E. Lee's birthday, George
23	Washington's birthday, Thomas Jefferson's birthday,

25	Davis' birthday, the Fourth day of July, Labor Day, Columbus

1 thanksgiving shall each be deemed a holiday. If any holiday 2 falls on Sunday, the following day is the holiday. If any holiday falls on Saturday, the preceding day is the holiday. 3 4 Veterans' Day shall be observed by the closing of all state, county, and municipal offices, all banks located within this 5 6 state, and the public schools on such day. Public schools, 7 grades K to 12, inclusive, and all public two-year institutions of higher education shall also be closed on 8 National Memorial Day, and such closing shall be applicable to 9 10 all students and non-essential employees. The Superintendent of Banks, with the concurrence of not less than two members of 11 12 the state Banking Board, may authorize any state bank to close on National Memorial Day, the last Monday in May, and on such 13 14 other days as may be declared by the Governor to be state 15 holidays in honor of a special event. If any authorized state holiday falls on Friday, the Superintendent of Banks may 16 17 authorize the Saturday following that Friday to be a holiday. The superintendent may also authorize the closing of banks at 18 12:00 noon on the day prior to Christmas Day, and the day 19 prior to New Year's Day, if such days fall on business days. 20

21 "(b) Of the above enumerated legal public holidays,
22 the following shall be observed on the dates herein
23 prescribed:

24 "(1) Robert E. Lee's birthday - the third Monday in 25 January.

26 "(2) George Washington's birthday - the third Monday 27 in February.

1 "(3) Confederate Memorial Day - the fourth Monday in 2 April. "(4) Jefferson Davis' birthday - the first Monday in 3 4 June. "(5) Columbus Day and Fraternal Day - the second 5 Monday in October. 6 7 "(6) Veterans' Day - the eleventh day of November. "(7) Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday - the third 8 9 Monday in January. 10 "(8) National Memorial Day - the last Monday in May. 11 "(9) Thomas Jefferson's birthday - the third Monday 12 in February. 13 "(10) American Indian Heritage Day - the second 14 Monday in October. 15 "(c)(1) For purposes of this section, Confederate Memorial Day and Jefferson Davis' birthday are unpaid 16 17 holidays, unless at the beginning of each calendar year, the Governor designates these holidays as paid holidays. If the 18 Governor does not declare these holidays as paid holidays, he 19 or she may designate up to two additional paid holidays during 20 21 the calendar year. "(2) Notwithstanding subdivision (1), there shall be 22 23 no more than 13 paid state holidays in a calendar year for 24 state employees. 25 "(3) For the purposes of this subsection, "unpaid 26 holiday" means a holiday for which a state employee receives 27 no compensation unless he or she uses annual leave or

3 "(c) (d) In addition to the legal holidays provided
4 above, Mardi Gras shall be deemed a holiday in Mobile and
5 Baldwin Counties and all state offices shall be closed in
6 those counties on Mardi Gras.

7 "(d) (e) In addition to the legal holidays provided above, all state employees, except those employed in Baldwin 8 and Mobile Counties, shall be granted one personal leave day 9 10 per year. The personal leave day shall be granted on January 1 of each year. All state employees employed in Baldwin and 11 12 Mobile Counties shall be granted no personal leave day. All 13 such personal leave days granted in any year shall be used by 14 the end of the calendar year. All such personal leave days 15 shall be scheduled during the year with the approval of the supervisor. Supervisors failing to schedule personal leave 16 17 days for employees shall justify that action in writing to the Director of State Personnel and the employee shall receive pay 18 at a rate not less than the employee's usual and customary 19 20 rate of pay for any personal leave day not taken by December 21 31 of each year.

"(e) (f) (1) All state holidays shall be observed by the closing of all state offices. Any state office may remain open on a state holiday upon written notice by the appointing authority to the State Personnel Board at least 60 days in advance of the holiday. Provided, that any state office may be opened in the event of an emergency and the State Personnel Board may grant a blanket approval for the openings of state offices needing to be open on holidays on a regular basis for essential services. Any state employee working on a state holiday shall receive a day one hour of compensatory leave or paid compensation for each hour worked upt to a maximum of eight hours in lieu of the holiday as provided herein.

7 "(2) For the purposes of this subsection, a "state
8 holiday" means an eight-hour day.

"(f) (g) Each employee shall attempt to schedule any 9 10 compensatory leave day provided in lieu of a regularly scheduled holiday, subject to the approval of the supervisor, 11 12 during the quarter that the regularly scheduled holiday occurred. If any compensatory leave day cannot be scheduled 13 14 during the designated quarter, the compensatory leave day may be accumulated at the request of the employee for up to one 15 year. Supervisors failing to schedule compensatory leave days 16 17 for employees within the quarter, unless the day is carried forward at the request of the employee, shall justify that 18 action in writing to the Director of State Personnel and the 19 employee shall receive pay at a rate not less than the 20 21 employee's usual and customary rate of pay for any compensatory leave day to which the employee may be entitled 22 and which has not been taken." 23

24 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 25 first day of the third month following its passage and 26 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
