 - "Section 4. (a) The proceeds of the fees generated by this act and Section 22-30B-2, Code of Alabama 1975, shall first be distributed in monthly installments, as follows:
- 8 "(1) Four thousand six hundred seventy five dollars 9 (\$4,675) to the Hill Hospital (Bond Obligation).

- "(2) Four thousand dollars (\$4,000) to the Sumter Industrial Board.
- "(3) Four thousand dollars (\$4,000) to the Solid

 - "(4) Four thousand dollars (\$4,000) to the City of Livingston to be used by the Fire and Rescue Department for training and equipment for response to hazardous material cleanup, containment, or disposal throughout the county. - "(c) (1) All recipients of funds pursuant to this section must be a nonprofit or governmental entity and must provide an annual financial report to the Chair of the Sumter County Commission and the Sumter County legislative delegation. The delegation may also adopt rules for and require the application of additional financial assurances of an entity, including the requirement of periodic audits of the entities.
 - "(2) If any nonprofit receiving payment pursuant to this section is dissolved or loses its nonprofit status, its distributive share shall be held in trust by the Sumter County Commission for up to one fiscal quarter and shall be redistributed by resolution to one or more nonprofit or governmental entities named in subsection (a) or (b)."

Section 2. All laws or parts of law in conflict with this act are repealed and replaced by this act and Act 90-612, (Acts 1990, p. 1124), 1990 Regular Session, as amended by Act 94-700, (Acts 1994, p. 1354), 1994 Regular Session, is hereby specifically repealed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the first month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
