8 SYNOPSIS: Under Section 71 of the Constitution of 9 Alabama of 1901, the general appropriation bill is 10 limited to appropriations for the ordinary expenses 11 of the executive, legislative, and judicial 12 departments of the state, for interest on the 13 public debt and for the public schools.

This bill would amend, effective January 1, 14 15 2017, Section 71 to provide that no appropriation 16 to the Alabama Medicaid Agency could exceed ten 17 percent of the total appropriations, nor could any 18 appropriation to the Alabama Department of 19 Corrections exceed five and one half percent of the 20 total appropriations. These limits could be 21 exceeded by a three-fifths vote of the elected 22 members of each house.

23 Section 71 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901,
24 is amended to read as follows:

25 Section 71. The general appropriation bill shall 26 embrace nothing but appropriations for the ordinary expenses 27 of the executive, legislative, and judicial departments of the

1 state, for interest on the public debt, and for the public 2 schools. The passage of the general appropriation bill shall be by a majority of those present and voting; however, passage 3 4 of a general appropriation bill that appropriates more than ten percent of total appropriations of state funds over which 5 6 the Legislature has discretionary control as to the recipient 7 of those funds to the Alabama Medicaid Agency, or more than five and one half percent of total appropriations of state 8 funds over which the Legislature has discretionary control as 9 to the recipient of those funds to the Alabama Department of 10 Corrections shall require an affirmative vote of at least 11 12 three-fifths of the elected members of each house of the 13 Legislature. The salary of no officer or employe shall be 14 increased in such bill, nor shall any appropriation be made therein for any officer or employe unless his employment and 15 16 the amount of his salary have already been provided for by 17 law. All other appropriations shall be made by separate bills, each embracing but one subject. 18

19 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 20 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 21 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 22 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 23 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 24 state.

25 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 26 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 27 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 1 following description of the substance or subject matter of 2 the proposed constitutional amendment:

3 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 4 Alabama of 1901, to become effective January 1, 2017, to limit the appropriation made to the Alabama Medicaid Agency at ten 5 6 percent of the total appropriations made; to limit the 7 appropriations to the Alabama Department of Corrections at five and one half percent of the total appropriations made; 8 and to provide that these limits can only be exceeded if the 9 10 appropriations bill was passed with an affirmative vote of 11 three-fifths of the elected members of each house of the 12 Legislature.
