BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) This act shall apply only in Class 1 and Class 2 municipalities.

- (b) Upon proper notice from the municipality as provided in this section, the Department of Revenue shall not issue or renew the registration of any motor vehicle whose owner or registrant has failed or refused to pay five or more parking tickets or citations issued for parking violations in the municipality.
- (c) Before notifying the Department of Revenue as provided in subsection (b), the municipality shall provide the owner or registrant of any vehicle which has accumulated five or more unpaid parking tickets or violations with written notice by first class mail to the address of the registered owner, as maintained in the records of the Department of Revenue, of its intent to seek suspension of the renewal of the vehicle registration pursuant to this section. If the vehicle is leased or rented by the owner, not more than 30 days after the initial notice of a parking violation for which a fine remains unpaid, the owner of the leased or rented vehicle shall provide to the municipality the name, address, and driver's license number, and state of issuance of the

renter or lessee, and the municipality shall issue a notice of violation to the renter or lessee.

(d) No sooner than 30 days after mailing the notice required under subsection (c), the municipality shall notify the Department of Revenue, in a format prescribed by the department, whenever an owner or registrant has failed to pay five or more parking tickets or citations issued for parking violations. Upon notice, the department shall not issue or renew the vehicle registration of any applicant who has failed to respond or pay five or more parking tickets or citations issued for parking violations, until such time that the department receives notice from the municipality that all of the tickets or violations have been dismissed, paid, reversed on appeal, or cancelled. The Commissioner of Revenue shall impose a fee of two dollars (\$2) per violation on each subsequent renewal to cover the costs of any enforcement action.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on January 1, 2016.
