BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 32-6-7.2, Code of Alabama 1975,
is amended to read as follows:

"§32-6-7.2.

10 "(a) A person who is under the age of 18 may not 11 apply for a Stage II restricted regular driver's license until 12 the person has held a Stage I learner's license issued 13 pursuant to Section 32-6-8 or a comparable license issued by 14 another state for at least a six-month period.

15 "(b) In addition to any other requirements of this 16 chapter, if the applicant for a driver's license is 16 years 17 of age, he or she shall submit to the Department of Public 18 Safety the following:

"(1) A verification form provided by the Department
of Public Safety signed by a parent or legal guardian, or a
grandparent with the consent of a parent or legal guardian,
consenting to the licensure of the applicant.

"(2) A verification form provided by the Department
of Public Safety signed by a parent, legal guardian, <u>a</u>
<u>grandparent with the consent of a parent or legal guardian</u>, or
<u>a</u> licensed or certified driving instructor, certifying that
the applicant has completed a minimum of 30 <u>50</u> hours of

behind-the-wheel driving practice, or submission of a
 certificate of completion from the State Department of
 Education that the applicant has passed a driver's education
 course approved by the State Department of Education.

5 "(c) A person who is issued a regular driver's 6 license who is age 17 and has been licensed for less than six 7 months or who is age 16 shall be deemed to have a Stage II 8 restricted driver's license. The person may not operate a 9 vehicle under any of the following conditions:

10 "(1) Between 12:00 o'clock midnight and 6:00 o'clock 11 a.m. unless one of the following exceptions applies:

12 "a. The licensee is accompanied by a parent or legal13 guardian.

14 "b. The licensee is accompanied by a person who is a 15 licensed driver and is at least 21 years of age or the consent 16 of a parent or legal guardian of the driver is given.

17 "c. The licensee is driving to or from a place where18 the licensee is employed or works.

19 "d. The licensee is driving to or from a school20 sponsored event.

21 "e. The licensee is driving to or from an event22 sponsored by a religious organization.

23 "f. The licensee is driving for the purpose of a24 medical, fire, or law enforcement related emergency.

25 "g. The licensee is driving to or from a place where 26 the licensee participates in hunting or fishing activities. In 27 order for this particular exception to apply, the licensee

1 must have in his or her immediate possession a valid hunting 2 or fishing license for the activity.

3 "(2) If there is more than one passenger in the 4 vehicle not including the parents, legal guardians of the 5 licensee, accompanying family members, or a licensed driver 6 who is at least 21 years of age.

7 "(3) While operating any handheld communication
8 device that is nonessential to the functioning of the vehicle.

9 "(d) A violation of subsection (c) shall not result 10 in a suspension of the person's driver's license, but shall 11 extend the time period for six months that the person is 12 subject to the restrictions of subsection (c) before the 13 person is eligible to be designated as an unrestricted 14 driver's license holder or until age 18.

15 "(e) The driver's license of any person who is 16 driving with restricted privileges as provided in subsection 17 (c) who during such time is convicted of a second moving 18 traffic violation or is convicted of failure to give 19 information or render aid, racing, fleeing or attempting to 20 elude a law enforcement officer, reckless driving, illegal 21 passing, driving on the wrong side of the road, or any other 22 offense where four or more points are assessed and other 23 violations as designated by rules or regulations promulgated 24 pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, shall be 25 automatically suspended for 60 days unless the Alabama Rules of the Road provide a more serious penalty, and the time 26 27 period that the licensee is subject to the restrictions of

subsection (c) shall be extended for six months from the date
 the person would otherwise be eligible to be designated as an
 unrestricted driver's license holder or until age 18.

4 "(f) The license possessed by any resident of this 5 state who is 17 years of age shall be deemed a Stage III 6 unrestricted driver's license if the license has been issued 7 for a period of six months or longer and the Department of 8 Public Safety verifies that the license holder has not been 9 convicted of a moving violation of the Alabama Rules of the 10 Road within the preceding six months.

"(g) This section shall not apply to the following:

12 "(2) Any resident who has otherwise been legally13 relieved of minority.

"(3) Any resident who is age 18 or over.

15 "(h) A person who drives a motor vehicle in 16 violation of the conditions imposed in subsection (c) shall be 17 guilty of a traffic violation, but shall not be subject to any criminal penalties or court costs. No citation shall be issued 18 19 for a traffic violation pursuant to this subsection unless the 20 person is stopped by a law enforcement officer for a separate violation of law and issued a citation or warrant for the 21 22 separate violation. Information concerning a violation 23 pursuant to this subsection shall not be released to any party 24 and shall not result in any points on a driver's license 25 record.

"(i) The Department of Public Safety may promulgate 1 2 reasonable rules and regulations to carry out and to aid in enforcement of this section and Sections 32-6-7.3 and 32-6-8. 3 "(j) As used in this section, the following words 4 5 shall have the following meanings: "(1) STAGE I. A learner's permit. 6 7 "(2) STAGE II. A regular driver's license with restrictions based on age and the date of issuance. 8 "(3) STAGE III. An unrestricted driver's license." 9 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 10 first day of the third month following its passage and 11 12 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
