25	funds by the Governor upon a determination that an emergency
26	exists and the funds are needed in order for the department to

respond to the occurrence of highly pathogenic avian influenza in this state.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The sum of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) is appropriated from the State General Fund in the State Treasury to the Department of Agriculture and Industries for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016, to be used by the department to respond to the occurrence of highly pathogenic avian influenza, including, but not limited to, for the depopulation and disposal of affected poultry and recovery efforts. The appropriation provided by this section shall be released only upon a written request by the Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries and a determination by the Governor that an emergency exists and that the funds are needed in order for the department to respond to the occurrence of highly pathogenic avian influenza in this state.

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or upon its otherwise becoming a law.
