Relating to sovereign immunity, to specify in statute that an officer, employee, or agent of the state, including a certified or noncertified employee of the State Board of Education or any local board of education, in his or her official capacity is immune from liability in any suit pursuant to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901; and to specify that these persons are not personally liable for any act that is incident to or within the scope of the duties of their position of employment with, or relationship to, the state and that involve the exercise of judgment or discretion, unless he or she acts willfully, maliciously, fraudulently, in bad faith, or beyond his or her authority.

22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) An officer, employee, or agent of the state acting in his or her official capacity is immune from liability in any suit pursuant to Article I, Section 14, of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

(b) An officer, employee, or agent of the state is not personally liable for any act that is incident to or within the scope of the duties of the person's position of employment with, or relationship to, the state and that involves the exercise of judgment or discretion on the part of the officer, employee, or agent, unless he or she acts willfully, maliciously, fraudulently, in bad faith, or beyond his or her authority. 

Section 2. (a) An employee of the State Board of Education or any local board of education acting in his or her official capacity is immune from liability in any suit pursuant to Article I, Section 14, of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

(b) An employee of the State Board of Education or any local board of education is not personally liable for any act that is incident to or within the scope of the duties of the person's employment and that involves the exercise of judgment or discretion on the part of the employee, unless he or she acts willfully, maliciously, fraudulently, in bad faith, or beyond his or her authority.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
