23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. Section 41-9-410 of the Code of Alabama
25	1975, is amended to read as follows:
26	"§41-9-410.

1 "(a) There is hereby created and established a 2 continuing Women's Commission, hereinafter referred to as the commission, which shall be composed of three members of the 3 4 House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the 5 House, two members of the Senate appointed by the President 6 Pro Tem of the Senate, and 10 members appointed by the 7 Governor. Of those members appointed by the Governor, one member shall be appointed from each congressional district as 8 9 the same are established on September 20, 1971, and two members shall be appointed from the state-at-large. At least 10 11 seven of the members appointed by the Governor shall be women. 12 The five members representing the Legislature shall be appointed for terms of two years, and their successors shall 13 14 be appointed for terms of two years. Of those members 15 appointed by the Governor, five members shall be appointed for terms of five years, and five members shall be appointed for 16 17 terms of three years, and the successors to such 10 appointees shall serve for terms of five years. 18

"(b) Five members of the commission shall constitute
a quorum for purposes of holding meetings and transacting the
business of the commission.

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"(c) Members shall be selected on the basis of their interests and knowledge in, and their ability to make contributions to, the solutions of problems related to the status of women.

"(d) The commission shall report to the Governor and the Legislature.

"(e) Vacancies on the commission shall be filled by
appointment in the same manner provided for the appointment of
the initial members. Any appointment to replace a member whose
position becomes vacant prior to the expiration of the term
shall be filled only for the remainder of the term.

"(f) Members of the commission shall receive no compensation for their services, except that they may be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incident to their duties as members of the commission, in accordance with state law."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
