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ENROLLED, An Act,

To amend Sections 27-7-4.4, 27-9A-17, and 27-25-4.6, 3 4 Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the licensing by the 5 Department of Insurance, insurance producers, title insurance agents, and independent adjusters, and authorizing the 6 7 Commissioner of Insurance to require the submission of 8 fingerprints for the purpose of criminal background checks; to 9 delete all reference to submitting and storing the electronic 10 fingerprint records with the National Association of Insurance 11 Commissioners for retention in a centralized repository and to 12 provide an exception for limited lines producers.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

14 Section 1. Sections 27-7-4.4, 27-9A-17, and 15 27-25-4.6, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as 16 follows:

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"§27-7-4.4.

18 "(a) In order to make a determination of insurance 19 producer license eligibility, the commissioner is authorized to require fingerprints of initial resident applicants for an 20 21 insurance producer license and to submit the fingerprints and 22 the fee required to perform the criminal history record checks 23 to the Alabama Department of Public Safety and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for state and national criminal 24 25 history record checks.

"(b) The commissioner shall require a criminal 1 2 history record check on each initial resident applicant for 3 insurance producer license in accordance with this section. The commissioner shall require each applicant to submit a full 4 5 set of fingerprints, including a scanned file from a hard copy fingerprint, in order for the commissioner to obtain and 6 receive national criminal history records from the FBI 7 8 Criminal Justice Information Services Division.

"(c) The commissioner may contract for the 9 10 collection, transmission, and resubmission of fingerprints required under this section. If the commissioner does so, the 11 12 fee for collecting, transmitting, and retaining fingerprints 13 shall be payable directly to the contractor by the applicant. 14 The commissioner may agree to a reasonable fingerprinting fee 15 to be charged by the contractor and both the contractor's fee 16 and the fee required to perform the criminal history check 17 shall be collected from the applicant by the contractor.

18 "(d) The commissioner may waive submission of 19 fingerprints by any person who has previously furnished 20 fingerprints and those fingerprints are on file with the 21 centralized repository of the NAIC.

"(e)(d) The commissioner is authorized to receive
 criminal history record information in lieu of the Alabama
 Department of Public Safety that submitted the fingerprints to
 the FBI.

1 "(f) The commissioner is authorized to submit 2 electronic fingerprint records and necessary identifying 3 information to the NAIC for permanent retention in a 4 centralized repository. The purpose of such a centralized 5 repository is to provide insurance commissioners with access 6 to fingerprint records in order to perform criminal history 7 record checks.

8 "(g)(e) The commissioner shall treat and maintain an applicant's fingerprints and any criminal history record 9 information obtained under this section as confidential and 10 shall apply security measures consistent with the Criminal 11 12 Justice Information Services Division of the Federal Bureau of 13 Investigation standards for the electronic storage of 14 fingerprints and necessary identifying information and limit 15 the use of records solely to the purposes authorized in this 16 section. The fingerprints and any criminal history record 17 information shall not be subject to subpoena, other than one 18 issued in a criminal action or investigation, and shall be 19 confidential.

20 "(h) (f) As used in this section, initial resident 21 applicant means an initial home state license and an 22 additional line of authority under an existing home state 23 license where a criminal history record check has not been 24 obtained.

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"(g) This section shall not apply to limited lines 1 2 producers. 3 "(i) (h) The commissioner may promulgate reasonable regulations as are necessary or proper to carry out the 4 purposes of this section in accordance with Chapter 2 of this 5 title. The commissioner may by regulation provide for the 6 delayed enforcement of this section for up to 24 months 7 8 following January 1, 2013, the effective date of the act amending this subsection to allow for implementation. 9 "\$27-9A-17. 10 11 "(a) In order to make a determination of license 12 eligibility, the commissioner may require fingerprints of 13 applicants and to submit the fingerprints and the fee required 14 to perform the criminal history record checks to the Alabama 15 Department of Public Safety and the Federal Bureau of 16 Investigation for state and national criminal history record 17 checks. 18 "(b) The commissioner may require a criminal history 19 record check on each applicant in accordance with this 20 section. The commissioner shall require each applicant to submit a full set of fingerprints, including a scanned file 21

from a hard copy fingerprint, in order for the commissioner to obtain and receive national criminal history records from the Criminal Justice Information Services Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. In the case of business entity

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1 applicants, the commissioner shall require the submission of 2 fingerprints of all of the following:

3 "(1) All executive officers and directors of the 4 applicant.

5 "(2) Any individual owning, directly or indirectly,
6 51 percent or more of the outstanding voting securities of the
7 applicant.

8 "(3) All executive officers and directors of 9 entities owning 51 percent or more of the outstanding voting 10 securities of the applicant.

"(c) The commissioner may contract for the collection, transmission, and resubmission of fingerprints required under this section. If the commissioner does so, the fee for collecting, transmitting, and retaining fingerprints shall be payable directly to the contractor by the person. The commissioner may agree to a reasonable fingerprinting fee to be charged by the contractor.

18 "(d) The commissioner may waive submission of
 19 fingerprints by any person that has previously furnished
 20 fingerprints and those fingerprints are on file with the
 21 centralized repository of the NAIC.

"(e)(d) The commissioner may receive criminal
history record information from the Federal Bureau of
Investigation in lieu of the information being submitted to
the Alabama Department of Public Safety.

"(f) The commissioner may submit electronic
fingerprint records and necessary identifying information to
the NAIC for permanent retention in a centralized repository.
The purpose of such a centralized repository is to provide
insurance commissioners with access to fingerprint records in
order to perform criminal history record checks.

"(q) (e) The commissioner shall treat and maintain an 7 8 applicant's fingerprints and any criminal history record information obtained under this section as confidential and 9 shall apply security measures consistent with the Criminal 10 Justice Information Services Division of the Federal Bureau of 11 Investigation standards for the electronic storage of 12 13 fingerprints and necessary identifying information and limit 14 the use of records solely to the purposes authorized in this 15 section. The fingerprints and any criminal history record 16 information shall not be subject to subpoena, other than one 17 issued in a criminal action or investigation, and shall be 18 confidential.

"(f) The commissioner, by regulation, may provide
 for the delayed enforcement of this section for up to 24
 months following the effective date of the act adding this
 subsection to allow for implementation.

24 "(a) In order to make a determination of title25 insurance agent license eligibility, the commissioner may

require fingerprints of initial applicants for a title insurance agent license, and the fingerprints and the fee required to perform the criminal history record checks shall be submitted to the Alabama Department of Public Safety and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for state and national criminal history record checks.

"(b) The commissioner shall require a criminal 7 8 history record check on each initial applicant for title insurance agent license pursuant to this section. The 9 10 commissioner shall require each applicant to submit a full set of fingerprints, including a scanned file from a hard copy 11 12 fingerprint, to allow the commissioner to obtain and receive 13 national criminal history records from the FBI Criminal Justice Information Services Division. 14

15 "(c) The commissioner may contract for the 16 collection, transmission, and resubmission of fingerprints 17 required pursuant to this section, and the fee for collecting, 18 transmitting, and retaining fingerprints shall be payable 19 directly to the contractor by the applicant. The commissioner may agree to a reasonable fingerprinting fee to be charged by 20 21 the contractor, and both the contractor's fee and the fee 22 required to perform the criminal history check shall be 23 collected from the applicant by the contractor.

24 "(d) The commissioner may waive submission of
 25 fingerprints by any person that has previously furnished

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fingerprints and those fingerprints are on file with the centralized repository of the NAIC.

3 "(e)(d) The criminal history record information may
4 be submitted to the commissioner instead of the Alabama
5 Department of Public Safety.

6 "(f) The commissioner may submit electronic 7 fingerprint records and necessary identifying information to 8 the NAIC for permanent retention in a centralized repository. 9 The purpose of a centralized repository is to provide 10 insurance commissioners with access to fingerprint records to 11 perform criminal history record checks.

12 "(g) (e) The commissioner shall treat and maintain an 13 applicant's fingerprints and any criminal history record 14 information obtained pursuant to this section as confidential 15 and shall apply security measures consistent with the Criminal Justice Information Services Division of the Federal Bureau of 16 17 Investigation standards for the electronic storage of 18 fingerprints and necessary identifying information and limit 19 the use of records solely to the purposes authorized in this section. The fingerprints and any criminal history record 20 information shall not be subject to subpoena, other than one 21 22 issued in a criminal action or investigation, and shall be 23 confidential.

24 "(f) The commissioner, by regulation, may provide
 25 for the delayed enforcement of this section for up to 24

4	immediately following its passage and approval by the
5	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
