To amend Section 23-4-20, Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the vacation of certain public roads or streets.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

7 Section 1. Section 23-4-20, Code of Alabama 1975, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9

"§23-4-20.

10 "(a) Subject to the conditions set out in this subsection, any street or alley may be vacated, in whole or in 11 part, by the owner or owners of the land abutting the street 12 13 or alley or abutting that portion of the street or alley 14 desired to be vacated by following the procedures set out 15 herein. The owner or owners of the land abutting the street or 16 alley to be vacated shall join in a written petition 17 requesting that the street or alley be vacated and shall file 18 the petition with the governing body with jurisdiction over 19 the street or alley, or portion thereof, requesting the 20 governing body's approval of the vacation. Following receipt 21 of the written request for assent, the governing body shall 22 act upon the request applying the same notice, hearing, 23 voting, and appeal procedures as set forth in Sections 23-4-2 24 and 23-4-5, and if The governing body shall set the request 25 for vacation for public hearing within 100 days from the date

1	the petition is received. Notice of the hearing shall be		
2	provided as set out in Section 36-25A-3 for notice of meetings		
3	of the governing body and shall describe the street or alley,		
4	or portion thereof, requested to be vacated in the petition. A		
5	copy of the notice shall also be served by U.S. mail at least		
б	30 days prior to the scheduled meeting on any abutting owner		
7	and on any entity known to have facilities or equipment such		
8	as utility lines, both above ground or buried, within the		
9	public right-of-way of the street or alley, or portion		
10	thereof, to be vacated. Except as provided in subsection (c),		
11	if the governing body elects to take action on the petition,		
12	the governing body shall follow the procedures in Section		
13	23-4-2(b) for taking the action. Any appeal of the decision of		
14	the governing body to vacate the street or alley, or portion		
15	thereof shall be as provided in Section 23-4-5. If the		
16	governing body approves the vacation, it shall have the same		
17	effect as provided therein in Section 23-4-2(b), including		
18	that the vacation shall not deprive other property owners of		
19	any right they may have to convenient and reasonable means of		
20	ingress and egress to and from their property, and if that		
21	right is not afforded by the remaining streets and alleys,		
22	another street or alley affording that right must be		
23	dedicated.		

24 "(b) The provisions of this section shall not be25 held to repeal any existing statute relating to the vacation

1	of roads, streets, or alleys, or parts thereof, and shall not
2	be held to limit or expand any civil causes of action
3	available under the law.
4	"(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection
5	(a) and Section 23-4-2 in conflict with this subsection, the
6	following procedures may be applied in counties where the
7	members of the county commission are elected by single-member
8	districts if the property owners submitting the petition to
9	vacate a street or alley or portion thereof are all members of
10	the same immediate family. If, following the public hearing
11	provided under subsection (a), the county commissioner from
12	the district in which the street or alley or portion thereof
13	does not move to vacate the street or alley or portion thereof
14	within 100 days, the question of whether to vacate the street
15	or alley or portion thereof may be placed on the agenda for a
16	regular county commission meeting if, within 30 days
17	thereafter:
18	" <u>(1) A written request to have the issue of vacating</u>
19	the street or alley or portion thereof placed on the agenda
20	for a regular county commission meeting is submitted to the
21	chair of the county commission by a majority of other members
22	of the county commission; and
23	"(2) A copy of the written request is delivered to
24	the district commissioner in whose district the street or

1	alley or portion thereof is located at the same time written
2	request is submitted to the chair.
3	"When the issue of vacating the street or alley or
4	portion thereof is placed on the county commission agenda
5	pursuant to the procedure set out herein, a motion to approve
6	the vacation may be made during the county commission meeting
7	at which the issue is debated by one of the members of the
8	county commission who made the written request.
9	"For the purpose of this subsection, "immediate
10	family" shall mean spouse, parent, child, sibling, and
11	grandparent.
12	"(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection
13	(a) or Section 23-4-2 in conflict with this subsection, and
14	except when an unpaved street or alley ends along a body of
15	water, if the county commission denies or does not take action
16	within 100 days after the public hearing is held on a petition
17	to vacate an unpaved street or alley which is filed by all
18	owners of property abutting all sides of the unpaved street or
19	alley from its beginning to the place where it ends, the
20	owners may file an action in the circuit court requesting an
21	order vacating the unpaved street or alley. The petition shall
22	be filed by all owners of property abutting all sides of the
23	<u>unpaved street or alley from its beginning to the place where</u>
24	it ends. Prior to any order for vacation being issued by the
25	court, the county commission shall be granted an opportunity

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1	to present evidence establishing why the unpaved street or			
2	alley should not be vacated. The court may issue an order for			
3	vacation of the street or alley pursuant to this subsection			
4	only upon an affirmative finding that:			
5	"(1) All owners of property abutting all sides of			
6	the unpaved street or alley from its beginning to the place			
7	where it ends have joined as plaintiffs in the civil action			
8	filed pursuant to this section; and			
9	"(2) Vacation of the unpaved street or alley will			
10	not deprive other property owners of any right they may have			
11	to convenient and reasonable means of ingress and egress to			
12	their property.			
13	"In the event the court grants the petition for			
14	vacation of the unpaved street or alley as provided in this			
15	subsection, the order shall include a specific finding that			
16	the county is divested of all public rights and liabilities in			
17	the unpaved street or alley, including any rights which may			
18	have been acquired by prescription. The plaintiffs shall be			
19	required to post signs along the unpaved street or alley			
20	providing notice that the unpaved street or alley is privately			
21	owned and is not maintained by the county. Vacation of the			
22	<u>unpaved street or alley shall not take effect until and unless</u>			
23	the signs are posted.			
24	"(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section,			
25	entities with utility lines, equipment, or facilities in place			

1	within or crossing a road at the time of vacation, shall have
2	the right to continue to access, maintain, extend, and enlarge
3	their lines, equipment, and facilities to the same extent as
4	if the vacation had not occurred. The entities may continue to
5	move across and along a vacated road to reach their lines,
6	equipment, and facilities for the above purposes and to the
7	same extent as if the vacation had not occurred."
8	Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict
9	with this act are repealed.
10	Section 3. This act shall become effective
11	immediately following its passage and approval by the
12	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
