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ENROLLED, An Act,

Relating to Randolph County; authorizing the sheriff to sell certain abandoned, stolen, and unclaimed property at public auction; providing for such an auction and for the disposition of proceeds; and authorizing the sheriff to sell or destroy certain abandoned, stolen, or unclaimed firearms.  
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) The Sheriff of Randolph County shall keep and maintain a permanent record of all abandoned and stolen personal property recovered by the sheriff's office. These records shall state the description of the property, the date of recovery of the property, and the serial or other identifying number of the property. The records shall be open to public inspection at all reasonable times.

(b) All abandoned or stolen property recovered by the sheriff's office shall be stored in a suitable place to protect the property from deterioration.

Section 2. If the abandoned or stolen personal property is of a perishable nature and reasonable attempts to locate and identify the owner of the property are not successful, the property may be sold at once without notice. The sheriff shall attempt to obtain the best possible price for the property. The proceeds of such a sale shall be held in a separate account for a period of six months for the owner.

1 During this period, the proceeds will be paid to the owner  
2 upon demand, less any cost of recovery, storage, maintenance,  
3 and sale. If the proceeds are not claimed within six months,  
4 after deducting and paying all expenses incurred in the  
5 recovery, storage, maintenance, and sale of the property, the  
6 net funds shall be paid to the office of the Sheriff of  
7 Randolph County.

8 Section 3. (a) The sheriff shall keep and maintain a  
9 permanent record of all abandoned or stolen firearms, not  
10 subject to disposition by general law. The records shall state  
11 the description of the firearm, the date of recovery of the  
12 firearm, and the serial or other identifying number, if any,  
13 of the firearm. Firearm as used in this act shall have the  
14 same meaning as defined in Section 13A-8-1 of the Code of  
15 Alabama 1975.

16 (b) Unless otherwise provided by law, the sheriff  
17 may sell or destroy these firearms if the owner of the firearm  
18 does not claim the firearm within six months of the date the  
19 sheriff obtained it.

20 (c) The sheriff may sell the firearms only to gun  
21 dealers who have held an active business license in this state  
22 for at least one year immediately prior to the date of the  
23 sale. The sheriff shall establish a procedure to notify gun  
24 dealers of a sale. A firearm shall be sold to the gun dealer  
25 submitting the highest sealed bid. All sales shall be on a

1 cash basis. The proceeds of the sale, after deducting and  
 2 paying all expenses incurred in the recovery, maintenance, and  
 3 sale of the firearms shall be paid to the office of the  
 4 Sheriff of Randolph County.

5 (d) The sheriff may establish a procedure to destroy  
 6 firearms and may expend necessary sheriff's office funds for  
 7 that purpose.

8 (e) Any firearm held by the sheriff on the effective  
 9 date of this act shall be subject to this section, but shall  
 10 be held for at least six months after the effective date of  
 11 this act.

12 Section 4. (a) As often as necessary, the sheriff  
 13 shall sell at public auction to the highest bidder all  
 14 abandoned or stolen personal property, other than firearms,  
 15 which has been recovered by the sheriff's office and has  
 16 remained unclaimed by the rightful owner for a six-month  
 17 period.

18 (b) Prior to the sale, notice shall be given by  
 19 publication in a newspaper of general circulation in Randolph  
 20 County once a week for two successive weeks or by posting  
 21 notice in a conspicuous place at the Randolph County  
 22 Courthouse and by posting on the sheriff's office website for  
 23 a period of at least 20 days. The notice shall contain the  
 24 place, date, and time of each auction and a general  
 25 description of items of personal property to be sold at the

1 auction. If publication of notice is made in the newspaper,  
2 the first notice shall run at least 20 days prior to the  
3 auction.

4 Section 5. The owner of any abandoned or stolen  
5 personal property recovered by the Randolph County Sheriff's  
6 Office, including firearms, may claim the property at any time  
7 prior to its sale by submitting sufficient proof of ownership  
8 as determined by the sheriff. The sheriff may require the  
9 owner to pay a pro rata share of the costs, if any, of  
10 publication of notice of the sale of the property.

11 Section 6. If property is sold at public auction, as  
12 provided in this act, a notation in the storage record shall  
13 be made of the sale and of the amount received for the  
14 property. The person making the sale may reject any and all  
15 bids if the amount bid is unreasonably low and may continue  
16 the sale, from time to time, if no bidders are present.

17 Section 7. The proceeds from the sale of property at  
18 an auction conducted under the authority of this act, after  
19 deducting and paying all expenses incurred in the recovery,  
20 storage, maintenance, and sale of property, shall be paid to  
21 the office of the Sheriff of Randolph County and shall be used  
22 solely for law enforcement purposes. The receipts and  
23 expenditures of funds shall be audited by the Examiners of  
24 Public Accounts.

1                   Section 8. This act shall become effective on the  
2 first day of the third month following its passage and  
3 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
