Section 1. The parent or legal guardian of a minor who is younger than 18 years of age may authorize treatment for any medical, dental, health, or mental health service, including commitment to a mental health facility, even if the minor has expressly refused such treatment.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
