Section 1. (a) A person 70 years of age or older shall be excused from being called to jury service upon request to the jury commission in the county in which he or she is requested to serve.

- (b) (1) A person 70 years of age or older may request to the jury commission that he or she be removed from the master list of potential jurors. Upon verification of the person's age, the jury commission shall remove the person from the master list of potential jurors.
- (2) A person who has been removed from the master list pursuant to subdivision (1) may request to be reinstated on the master list provided that he or she satisfies the qualifications required by Article 2A, Chapter 16, Title 12, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
