(b) Each school district may adjust school start times based on student safety and available daylight as a result of this section.

(c) The Department of Agriculture and Industries may
 study adjustments in standard agricultural practices as a
 result of this section.

Section 2. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the
Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
