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1 To propose an amendment to the Constitution of 2 Alabama of 1901, to allow the voters of this state to determine whether the State of Alabama shall participate in 3 the expansion of Medicaid as provided by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act; and the Governor, within 5 30 days after the ratification of this amendment, shall enroll 6 7 the State of Alabama in the Medicaid expansion as provided by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 9 10 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and 11 12 shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a 13 majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution 14 of Alabama of 1901, as amended: 15 PROPOSED AMENDMENT 16 17 Section 1. The Legislature finds all of the following: 18

(1) The residents of this state are suffering because of their lack of access to health care.

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- (2) Broad access to health care leads to preventive care, which produces healthier families, a healthier workforce, and an all around healthier state.
- (3) The federal government will pay 100 percent of the Medicaid expansion for three years starting in 2014 under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. After that

time, the federal government's share will drop to 95 percent in 2017, and ultimately to 90 percent in 2020.

- (4) With the expansion of Medicaid, hundreds of thousands of Alabamians will have access to critical preventive care versus acute care for the first time in their lives.
 - (5) Expansion of Medicaid will result in reduced state spending on health care related services to those previously uninsured residents with incomes below 133 percent of the federal poverty limit.
 - (6) In addition to enhancing access to health care, expansion of Medicaid would promote revenue and economic activity in this state, resulting in the preservation and creation of jobs.

Section 2 (a) The State of Alabama shall participate in the Medicaid program made available to the states under the "Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act," Public Law 111-148, March 23, 2010, as amended by the "Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010," Public Law 111-152, March 30, 2010.

(b) The Governor, within 30 days after the ratification of this amendment, shall enroll the State of Alabama in the Medicaid expansion as provided by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284

1 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 2 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 3 state. Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 5 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 6 7 following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment: 8 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 9 10 Alabama of 1901, to allow the voters of this state to 11 determine whether the State of Alabama shall participate in 12 the expansion of Medicaid as provided by the Patient 13 Protection and Affordable Care Act; and require the Governor, within 30 days after the ratification of this amendment, to 14 15 enroll the State of Alabama in the Medicaid expansion as provided by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. 16 17 "Proposed by Act ." 18 This description shall be followed by the following language: 19
