| 19 | Section 1. Beginning with the first payday on                  |
| 20 | October 1, 2013, all state employees who are listed in the     |
| 21 | classified and unclassified service of the state as defined in |
| 22 | Section 36-26-10, Code of Alabama 1975, and all other state    |
| 23 | employees and hourly employees of the state, except those set  |
| 24 | out in Section 2, and all legislative personnel, officers, and |
| 25 | employees, including, but not limited to, Legislative          |
| 26 | Reference Service personnel, whether subject to the state      |
| 27 | Merit System or not, and all employees of the county health    |

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departments who are employed subject to the state Merit System and whose compensation is paid out of a budget provided and agreed upon by the state, county, or other contributing agency under the direction of the State Board of Health shall receive a five percent cost-of-living salary increase for each of the fiscal year 2014-2015.

Section 2. (a) Any cost-of-living increase granted
under this act shall in no way apply to any local supplement
provided to any judges or to any other local employee whose
salary is tied to that of any state employee.

(b) This act shall not apply to any Merit System
employee or hourly employee whose service or rate of pay is
covered by any labor agreement or contract.

Section 3. The Director of the State Personnel 14 15 Department shall revise the schedule of rates set forth in the pay plan for state employees and shall send the same to the 16 17 state Comptroller, who shall issue warrants in accordance therewith. With respect to all court officials and employees 18 within the Unified Judicial System who serve the trial and 19 appellate courts of the state and the Administrative Office of 20 21 Courts, the Administrative Director of Courts shall revise the 22 schedule of rates set forth in the pay plan for these court 23 officials and employees to reflect the increase provided in 24 this act, and shall certify the same to the state Comptroller, who shall issue warrants in accordance therewith. With respect 25 to employees of the Legislature, the Secretary of the Senate 26 for employees of the Senate, the Clerk of the House of 27

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Representatives for employees of the House, the Director of 1 2 Legislative Reference Service for employees of the Legislative Reference Service, and the Director of Legislative Fiscal 3 4 Office for employees of the Legislative Fiscal Office shall revise the schedule of rates set forth in the pay plan for 5 6 their employees to reflect the increase provided in this act 7 and shall certify the same to the state Comptroller, who shall issue warrants in accordance therewith. 8

9 Section 4. It is not the intent of this act to make 10 appropriations, but the appropriations required by this act 11 shall be made in the annual budget act for the affected 12 entities.

Section 5. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
