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AN ACT
Relating to public education; to establish class
size limits in grades kindergarten to 12, inclusive, beginning

the state.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
Section 1. (a) To assure that children attending
public schools obtain a high quality education, the
Legislature shall make adequate provision to ensure that, by
the beginning of the 2018-2019 school year, there are a
sufficient number of classrooms so that:
(1) The maximum number of students who are assigned
to each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms
for prekindergarten to grade 3, inclusive, does not exceed 15
students.
(2) The maximum number of students who are assigned
to each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms
for grades 4 to 8, inclusive, does not exceed 22 students.
(3) The maximum number of students who are assigned
to each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms
for grades 9 to 12, inclusive, does not exceed 25 students.
(b) The class size requirements of this section do
not apply to extracurricular classes.

(c) Payment of the costs associated with reducing 1 2 class size to meet the requirements of this section is the responsibility of the state and not of local school systems. 3 4 Beginning with the 2014-2015 fiscal year, the Legislature shall provide sufficient funds to reduce the average number of 5 students in each classroom by at least two students per year 6 7 until the maximum number of students per classroom does not exceed the requirements of this section. 8

9 Section 2. This act shall become effective 10 immediately following its passage and approval by the 11 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
