5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

6 Section 1. The Director of the Department of Public 7 Safety shall establish a classification Trooper First Class 8 for persons who are initially employed as a state trooper and 9 establish a pay scale for the classification.

10 Section 2. (a) Notwithstanding any provision of law, the Department of Public Safety may recover the actual 11 12 training costs incurred for a person to be employed with the 13 department if the person does not maintain full-time 14 employment for three years after his or her initial employment 15 with the department. The department may allow the person to repay the costs in monthly installments which may not exceed 16 17 60 months.

(b) A person who cannot maintain his or her
employment with the department because of an illness or duty
in the United States Military or the Alabama National Guard
shall be exempt from the training costs repayment requirement
of subsection (a).

23 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 24 first day of the third month following its passage and 25 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
