10 Section 1. The following amendment to the 11 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and 12 shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a 13 majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in 14 accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution 15 of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

## PROPOSED AMENDMENT

17 "(a) Senators and representatives shall be elected by the qualified electors on the first Tuesday after the first 18 Monday in November unless the legislature shall change the 19 time of holding elections and in every fourth year thereafter. 20 21 The terms of office of the senators and representatives shall commence on the day after the general election at which they 22 23 are elected, and expire on the day after the general election 24 held in the fourth year after their election, except as 25 otherwise provided in this Constitution. At the general 26 election in the year nineteen hundred and two all the 27 representatives, together with the senators for the even

1 numbered districts and for the thirty-fifth district, shall be 2 elected. The terms of those senators who represent the odd numbered districts under the law in force prior to the 3 4 ratification of this Constitution, are hereby extended until the day after the general election in the year nineteen 5 hundred and six; and until the expiration of his term as 6 7 hereinbefore extended, each such senator shall represent the district established by this Constitution, bearing the number 8 corresponding with that for which he was elected. In the year 9 10 nineteen hundred and six, and in every fourth year thereafter, 11 all the senators and representatives shall be elected.

12 "(b) Whenever a vacancy occurs in either house of 13 the legislature the governor shall issue a writ of election to 14 fill such vacancy for the remainder of the term. However, if 15 the secretary of state determines that a legally qualified 16 candidate for election to the vacancy is unopposed when the 17 last date for filing certificates of nomination has passed, the election shall not be held. The secretary of state shall 18 issue a certificate of election to the candidate, the same as 19 if an election had been held, and the certificate shall be 20 21 accepted by the house in which the vacancy occurred as 22 evidence of the unopposed candidate's right to fill the 23 position created by the vacancy. In the event an election is held, all except as otherwise provided in subsection (c), the 24 25 costs and expenses incurred thereby shall be paid out of any 26 funds in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated.

"(c) A departing incumbent who leaves office for
reasons other than illness, death, or election or appointment
to another public office shall pay the costs and expenses of
the election.

5 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 6 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 7 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 8 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 9 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 10 state.

Section 3. The appropriate election official shall assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the following description of the substance or subject matter of the proposed constitutional amendment:
