8 SYNOPSIS:

Under existing law, a person commits the offense of fraudulent repair of an airbag if, after an airbag has deployed in a motor vehicle, he or she installs a new airbag that the person knew was not designed in accordance with applicable federal standards or installs a used airbag in a motor vehicle and fails to disclose to the owner that a used airbag was installed.

This bill would define the term "airbag" and rename this offense "airbag fraud" and would provide criminal penalties for importing, installing, reinstalling, selling, or offering to sell a counterfeit or nonfunctional airbag, selling, installing, or reinstalling a device in a motor vehicle that causes the vehicle's diagnostic system to inaccurately indicate that the vehicle is equipped with a functional airbag, or installing or requesting another to install a counterfeit or nonfunctional airbag and selling or offering to sell the vehicle to another person with the intent

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to deceive the purchaser about the existence of the counterfeit airbag or nonfunctional airbag in the vehicle.

This bill would also provide enhanced criminal penalties if the airbag fraud caused physical injury to a person.

Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

26	Section 1. Section 13A-11-270, Code of Alabama 1975

is amended to read as follows:

2	"(a) For the purposes of this section, the following

4	"(1) AIRBAG. A motor vehicle inflatable occupant
5	restraint system or any component thereof that satisfies both

10	year of the motor vehicle in which it is or will be installed.
11	"(2) COUNTERFEIT AIRBAG. A replacement motor vehicle
12	inflatable occupant restraint system or any component thereof
13	displaying a mark identical or similar to the genuine mark of
14	a motor vehicle manufacturer without authorization from the
15	manufacturer.
16	"(3) NONFUNCTIONAL AIRBAG. A replacement motor
17	vehicle inflatable occupant restraint system or any component
18	thereof that satisfies any of the following:
19	"a. Was previously deployed or damaged.
20	"b. Has a fault that is detected by the vehicle
21	diagnostic system after the installation procedure is
22	<pre>completed.</pre>
23	"c. Includes any part or object, including, but not
24	limited to, a counterfeit airbag, a nonfunctional airbag, or a
25	repaired airbag cover, installed in a motor vehicle to mislead

1	"(a)(b) A person commits the offense of fraudulent
2	repair of an airbag <u>fraud</u> if, after an airbag has been
3	deployed in a motor vehicle, the person knowingly and
4	intentionally as defined in Section 13A-2-2, does either any
5	of the following:
6	"(1) Installs Manufactures, imports, sells, offers
7	for sale, installs, or reinstalls a new counterfeit airbag, a
8	nonfunctional airbag, or any other device to replace an airbag
9	which that the person knew was not designed in accordance with
10	all applicable federal safety standards for the make, model,
11	and year of the motor vehicle.
12	"(2) Installs a used airbag in a motor vehicle and
13	fails to disclose to the owner or lessee that a used airbag
14	has been installed.
15	"(3) Sells any device, or installs or reinstalls in
16	any vehicle any device, that causes the vehicle's diagnostic
17	system to inaccurately indicate that the vehicle is equipped
18	with a functional airbag when a counterfeit airbag,
19	nonfunctional airbag, or no airbag is installed.
20	"(4) Installs or requests another to install a
21	counterfeit airbag or nonfunctional airbag and sells or offers
22	to sell the vehicle to another person with the intent to
23	deceive the purchaser about the existence of the counterfeit
24	airbag or nonfunctional airbag in the vehicle.
25	"(b) Fraudulent repair of an airbag (c) Airbag fraud
26	is a Class A misdemeanor. If the fraud contributes to a
27	person's physical injury, airbag fraud is a Class C felony."

Section 2. Section 13A-11-271, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the fraudulent sale of a motor vehicle without an airbag, is repealed.

Section 3. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
